GAMBLE'S HUNDRED by Clifford Dowdy: Set in a rather neglected period of Southern Colonial history, the author has shown us the Virginia Colony in the flux, that never-ending conflict between tidewater and back country; the rise of the great planters and defeat of the small farmer. This is a stimulating novel with sharply drawn contrasted characters and gives one a gripping convincing story of human beings.

DOWN WIND by George Digby: Readers who were charmed by the author's first story of his adventures, "Goose Feathers," will welcome this second chapter, which though not as romantic is equally adventurous. Digby develops into the "armchair adventurer's ideal delegate to cities and countries of the world." He keeps moving along, working at everything that comes to hand, journalism in China, rabbiting in Australia, nursemaid to prisoners, living the life of each profession as it comes to him. Information which he gives about cities and countries he visits can not be found in any guide book or other travel book.

WICKFORD POINT by John P. Marquand: In the new novel by the author of the 1938 Pulitzer prize winner, we find a character indeed a whole group of characters that anyone will recognize as having known at some time or other. Here is satire blended with sympathy that will be appreciated by any reader. The picture of Jim Calder and those incredible relatives the Brill Family of Wickford Point is a work of distinction and originality.
