Sheriff's Officers Issuing 1940 Bike Licenses

The Vermont avenue station of the Sheriff's office at 10817 South Vermont now has the 1940 bicycle license plates on hand and is issuing them at schools in this district.

Each school is being visited by officers of the bicycle detail. License plate fee is 25 cents and there may be but one visit made to each school. Any pupil not availing himself of the opportunity of obtaining the license at the time the officers visit his school will be required to make the trip to the Vermont avenue station on a Saturday morning to obtain the license.

All bicycles used on public highways of the county must bear a valid 1940 license plate, sealed on. Failure to comply with this requirement is a violation of Los Angeles County Ordinance No. 3027, and constitutes a misdemeanor offense. For those not attending schools, they may obtain license plates at the Vermont avenue station on Saturday mornings, from 8 a. m. to 11 a. m.
