## Lettuce and Tomatoes Lead Truck Crops

Lettuce, which is grown in considerable quantity in San Fernando valley, was the most valuable truck crop produced in the state during 1939, according to a survey made by the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce with funds provided by the board of supervisors.

Value of the crop was \$22,008,000. Tomatoes, grown extensively along the Palos Verdes hills, were second, returning \$11,083,000 followed by cantaloupes, with \$7,311,000, asparagus with \$6,885,000 and peas with \$6,694,000.

California's vegetable and melon crops in 1939 were valued at \$83,309,000, which was about \$5,000,000 above the 1938 crop. Average for the five years from 1935 to 1937 was given as \$75,190,000. There were 11,650 acres of lettuce, \$1,170 acres of tomatoes, 76,750 acres of asparagus and 43,740 acres of cantaloupes that made up the crop.
