Frolic Planning Starts Monday

Preliminary plans for the third annual Frolic, a three-day September event, will be discussed at a meeting at the Chamber of Commerce Monday evening, April 15, starting at 8 o'clock.

Invitations have been sent to all organizations in the city urging that representatives attend. Among items scheduled for discussion are the dates for the 1940 Frolic, parade features, concessions, exhibits, entertainment and the manner of raising funds to defray expenses of the community celebration.

Early contact with possible exhibitors is also essential in order that Torrance products may be well displayed in the Civic Auditorium, according to president R. R. Smith.

Last year Fay Parks, owner of the Torrance Plumbing Company, was general chairman. Jack Miller, owner of the M & M Transfer Company, participated in managing the first Frolic staged in October, 1938. Last year the date was advanced to September because of cool weather.

Widow Tells Attack Story in City Court

After Mrs. Clarisse Heisler, 35-year-old Hawthorne widow, had repeated her version of the alleged assault and attempted attack committed by Edwin Joseph Savant, 26, 927 Arlington avenue, City Judge Robert Lessing held the defendant to answer to superior court Friday morning.

No testimony was introduced by Savant altho his attorney, Kenneth Hughes cross-examined Mrs. Heisler briefly on her story of what occurred on South Western avenue on the afternoon of March 25 when Savant was taking her home from a Hermosa Beach cocktail bar.

The court reduced the two charges to assault with intent to commit an attack and Savant's bail was set at \$250. He will be arraigned on the morning of April 22 in Department 41 of Superior court. Harry Hall, deputy district attorney, conducted the prosecution at the preliminary hearing here.

Mrs. Heisler testified she was introduced to Savant by a "girl friend" and had several drinks with him in Hermosa Beach but did not know his name until after she had checked his automobile license number to learn who her alleged attacker was.
