

School Population Here Now 2,201

During the past week 76 more boys and girls enrolled in Torrance schools, according to survey of enrollment figures made at the five institutions yesterday. The total number of children now attending schools here is 2,201 as compared with 2,125 who enrolled on the first day of the new term, Sept. 16.

Torrance high school gained 20 for a total of 847, the elementary school took in 38 more for 816, Fern street gained 13 for 303, Walteria added six for 111 and the Perry school in North Torrance lost one, reducing its attendance to 124.

Fire Waste Curtails National Defense, Fire Warden Says

National fire waste is serious enough to the nation in peace time but may be doubly tragic in interfering with National defense, County Fire Warden Spence Turner said today in calling attention to Fire Prevention Week which opens next month.

"Natural resources now are the basis of all industry and maximum production now is required to protect our country," he added. "Loss of human life or destruction of property by fire is a crime against the nation, and fire prevention is a patriotic duty of all citizens."

Fire Prevention Week—the second week in each October—is the annual organized effort to make the nation realize that most fires are preventable, Turner said. Nearly all loss from fire can be prevented if every citizen will take a few common sense precautions and habitually exercise care about his home, his place of work, in the forest and elsewhere, the fire warden added.

Register at Once If You're 21

Several thousand first presidential voters are expected to be added to the total in Los Angeles county and other sections of the state as result of instructions sent out to deputy registrars in the field late last week from the office of Registrar of Voters W. M. Kerr.

Voters who become 21 years of age between Sept. 26, when registration closes for the November election, and Nov. 5, may register until the close of registration next Thursday night, even though they are not 21 years of age, the deputies were informed.

The instruction was given following refusal of some field deputies to register young men and women in this age class, according to Attorney Lin Price. The Constitution provides that every native citizen of the United States of the age of 21 years who shall have resided in the state one year preceding the November 5 presidential election shall be entitled to vote if he or she has been residing in the county 90 days and in the election precinct 40 days.
