Dodge Announces Prices of 1941 Passenger Cars

Release of prices for 1941 Dodge passenger car models has been authorized by Forest H. Akers, vice-president and director of sales of the Dodge division of Chrysler Corporation, and was received here today by Walter G. Lind, Dodge-Plymouth dealer in Redondo Beach.

For the 1941 season, Dodge offers two distinct model series of Luxury Liners, one termed the DeLuxe Series, the other to be known as the Custom Series. While both series present entirely new designs, only the 1941 DeLuxe Series, comprising three models, affords a basis for price comparison with the DeLuxe line of 1940. The newly-introduced 1941 Custom Series is said to establish a new lineup of further enhanced values and, accordingly, an additional range of slightly different prices.

Though the 1941 prices of the DeLuxe Series show increases over the prices of the similarly designated models of 1940, the highest increase is but 2.1 percent, the lowest being 1.1 percent, making the average 1941 DeLuxe model price advance 1.6 percent.

Thus the Detroit delivered price—including federal taxes—for the 1941 Dodge DeLuxe Coupe is \$825 as against \$808 for 1940; for the 2-door DeLuxe sedan, \$880 as against \$865 for 1940; for the 4-door DeLuxe sedan, \$920 compared to the 1940 figure of \$910.

The new Dodge Custom Series for 1941 comprises four models—a 2-door Brougham listing at \$925; a 6 passenger coupe at \$960; a 4-door sedan at \$965; and a custom Town Sedan at \$995.

The prices listed, Mr. Akers pointed out, are for cars with or without running boards, and include bumpers, bumper guards, new safety-type wheels, spare wheel and tire, two tail lights, safety glass in all windows, deluxe type steering wheels, fenders and sheet metal finished to harmonize with a variety of new body colors. The custom series prices also include "air-foam" seat cushions.

Eleven Questions Basis of Draft Signup Oct. 16

All men between the ages of 21 and 36 will be required to register at their polling places on Oct. 16 as the first step in the selective service program. The questions each man will be asked on the original registration are summarized in the following story.

SACRAMENTO (U.P.)—Each man who registers on Oct. 16 for the selective service program will be asked 11 questions confined to information needed for notifying him if his number is drawn for the draft.

After filling out the questions and receiving an identification card showing his registration, the man may or may not receive a detailed eight-page questionnaire, depending on whether he is chosen for service. On the basis of the later questionnaire, which includes information on marital status, employment and other data that would affect possible deferment, the actual conscripts will be called.

The preliminary questions to be asked Oct. 16 are as follows:

1. Full name.
2. Full address.
3. Telephone number where can be reached easily.
4. Age in years and exact date of birth.
5. Place of birth; if foreign born, name of country at time of birth.
6. Country of citizenship.
- 7, 8 and 9. Name of persons who will always know your address; his relationship, and address.
10. Employer's name (self, firm, WPA, college, etc.)
11. Place of employment or business.

Election Boards Volunteer Draft Services to County

Return post cards by the thousands continued to pour in at the offices of the board of supervisors today, from election board members who are volunteering their services on national draft registration day October 16.

Almost spontaneous was the reply of board members to the call of the supervisors for the personnel for the one-day registration. An estimated 7000 cards were delivered to the supervisors' offices Thursday, the first day's response to cards sent out the first of the week.

Pierce Fazel of the department of administrative research has been designated by the supervisors to send out the cards and to check the replies against the election board personnel. About 31,000 cards were sent out.
