


Robertson Tried Hard, but California Won Game

Site Chosen for Shoestring Strip Fire Station

A new Shoestring Strip fire station for East Torrance and Harbor City, approved as a Los Angeles city sponsored W. P. A. project, will be built at 182nd street and Vermont avenue, according to Chief Fire Engineer J. H. Alderson of Los Angeles.

Work opening is slated to begin before the first of the year, with cost estimated at \$20,000. The city is now obtaining deed to the property, which the fire department believes is sufficiently near the harbor to tie in with the Wilmington and San Pedro fire companies in protecting property in both East Torrance and Harbor City.

To house a company of 12 men, working two shifts, the structure will be of one-story stucco construction. A combination hose, pump and chemical truck will be assigned to the new station, one of 12 to be built by the city as WPA projects.
