For peace on that Holy Day.


When strife is ended and war is

- Cranberry Sherbet
- Roast Turkey
- Oyster or Sausage Stuffing
- Lemon Sweet Potatoes
- Piquante Spinach with Beets
- Grapefruit and Celery Salad
- Fig or Plum Pudding
- Delicious Sauce
- Coffee

(All Recipes Tested by Good Housekeeping Institute)

Use Institute-approved measuring cups and spoons. Measure level.

- Cranberry Sherbet**
4 c. cranberries
2 1/2 c. water
1/4 c. granulated sugar
1 tsp. plain, unflavored gelatin
1/2 c. cold water
1 cup lemon juice
- Lemon Sweet Potatoes**
8 medium-size yams or sweet potatoes
1/2 c. butter or margarine
4 tsp. dark-brown sugar
1/2 c. vinegar
1 to 1 1/2 tsp. salt
2 tsp. grated lemon rind
Hot milk
- Piquante Spinach with Beets**
2 lb. spinach
2 1/2 tsp. salt
1/4 c. butter or margarine
3/4 cup. pepper
4 medium hard-cooked eggs, chopped
- Grapefruit and Celery Salad**
Arrange canned or fresh grapefruit sections on any salad greens,
allowing 3 sections for each serving. Sprinkle with match-shaped pieces
of celery and chopped ripe olives. Serve each with 1 to 2 tsp. of the fol-
lowing French dressing.

1 c. onion-fine sugar
1 egg, beaten
1 tsp. vanilla extract
