Ford Working Top-Speed to Supply Demand

Hot upon the heels of news that a record-shattering January had set new, all-time high sales marks by the handfull, came news this week from Schultz & Peckham, local Ford dealers, that Ford Motor Company production lines supplying the Southern California-Arizona market were working at top speed to keep up with a constantly-increased demand for 1941 Ford cars.

At the same time the local dealers revealed that word from J. R. Davis, Ford's Western sales supervisor, on early February sales, indicates that this month, too, will excel all existing February records.

Springtime Is Housecleaning Time

Salvation Army Will Be Glad to Call for Cast-Offs

This is the month for housecleaning. To the housewife it is a busy season. To the man of the house it is a periodical headache. This tremendous task was financed solely from the proceeds of discarded furniture, household materials, clothing, shoes, rags, rugs, newspapers, magazines, and other cast-off, materials contributed by the housewives of the community.

"We are proud of the hearty support of the housewives of the community in maintaining our record of public service to the destitute of the community. Their splendid cooperation made it possible for us to feed and house hundreds of men each month, and to contribute more than \$25,000 in cash allowances during the past year, to help in their rehabilitation to self-supporting men and useful law abiding citizens, no longer a public charge or menace to the community," stated Brigadier Sydney L. Cooke, officer in command of the Men's Social Service Department for the South Bay District.
