

'Wrong Way' Corrigan Calls Here for Airport Information

There are some folks who would say Douglas Corrigan, famous "wrong way" Atlantic flier, was still on the wrong track when he dropped in at the Torrance Chamber of Commerce Monday to find out about that "Torrance airport" he's been hearing about.

They would claim that there's about as much chance for Torrance to acquire an airport on the Western part of the city as Corrigan has of becoming Secretary of Aviation.

But that's neither here nor there while Corrigan, in person, was actually in Torrance. He wanted to know what the prospects are for the airport. Secretary L. J. Gilmeister was away at a conference but Miss Dorothy Jensen, his assistant, gave the noted airman a detailed report on the negotiations to get an oil lease lifted from the ranch acreage and various and sundry other matters adjusted leading toward establishment of the proposed airfield.

Explaining he was in a hurry, Corrigan left just before Miss Jensen was going to ask him if he "really meant to fly to Ireland." He said he was interested in an airplane manufacturing site in this district.

Fire Warden to Train Air Raid Wardens in Co.

Training and administration of thousands of air raid wardens is assigned to County Fire Warden Spence D. Turner, under the state-wide defense plan being formed to operate in conjunction with the National Civilian Defense program, it was disclosed today.

Demolition and chemical squads necessary to effectively prepare for the defense of civilians also are to be trained and administered by the county fire warden's department, it was learned.

Already well under way is a survey of the Central California Rural Fire Association for an emergency fire protection plan which will enable the various counties to cooperate for mutual protection.

This committee will cooperate for the protection of army and navy posts if necessary. The survey in Los Angeles county is being directed by Turner, who will also assist in coordination of the entire emergency fire plan.

Announces 1942 Campaign Intentions

PHOENIX, Ariz.—(U.P.)—Working on the theory that the early bird gets the worm, Howard Sproule of Globe has announced his candidacy for the Democratic gubernatorial nomination in 1942—scarcely six weeks after Gov. Sidney P. Osborn took office for a two year term.

New Steel-Union Pact Ups Payroll

"job protection" for employees called into military service. The wage increase is retroactive to April 1, a stipulation demanded by the union in twice extending the old contract past the original April 1 expiration date.

"Big Steel's" action followed by a few hours an announcement that 90,000 employees of Bethlehem Steel Company will receive a similar increase. Previously the National Steel Corporation and several smaller companies had boosted wages the same amount.

The clause relating to the pay increase in the new contract states, in part, that it shall affect "all rates which are at present \$5 a day or a minimum for this classification of \$5.80 a day of eight hours. Such classifications now receiving less than \$5 a day or less than 62 1/2 cents per hour shall be increased 10 cents per hour. There shall be an increase of 10 cents per hour in all other hourly rates and an equivalent increase in all tonnage and piece-work rates which will result in an increase of 30 cents per day of eight hours."

Price Rise Certain The new agreement, like the old contract, may be changed provided either side gives 10 days written notice of a desire to negotiate changes. If agreement has not been reached within 20 days after the notice, the contract will terminate.

One of the big questions among steel consumers was whether the wage boosts would cause a rise in the price of steel. It was generally agreed the answer is "yes," especially if soft coal wages and prices go up as well. Steel executives estimated that the pay increase and its attendant gain in clerical work would mean a gain of about 12 percent in operating costs.

Some of the features of the new contract are: That the Columbia Steel Company recognizes S.W.O.C. as the collective bargaining agency for those employees who are members of the union; no discrimination, interference, restraint or coercion by the company or its agents against any union members; the union agrees not to intimidate or coerce employees into membership and not to solicit mem-
