OBITUARY

MRS. IRENE L. GUTH

Funeral services for Mrs. Irene L. Guth were conducted Saturday at Pierce Brothers chapel Los Angeles, with Rev. F. C. McLean officiating. Interment followed at Inglewood Park cemetery. Mrs. Guth, who died at a rest home May 15, resided at 1913 Cabrillo ave. She was a native of Santa Claus, Indiana. Surviving is her husband, Edward L. Guth.

Mrs. Guth, nee Tischendorf, was born Sept. 30, 1879. On Nov. 27, 1907 she was married to Edward L. Guth at Cincinnati, Ohio. To them were born two sons who died in infancy. Mrs. Guth was a member of the Methodist church in her early years and later was united with the Immanuel Presbyterian church of Los Angeles. She was a graduate of the State Normal school at Terre Haute, Ind., and Nelson's Business College in Cincinnati.

She taught school and later became a bookkeeper, holding responsible positions. Mr. and Mrs. Guth came to California in 1919. They built several homes and in 1930 erected the Southcott Inn in Torrance. Mrs. Guth took a deep personal interest in this hostelry and enjoyed making her guests comfortable. It afforded her much joy to have, in the most part, cultured men and women as her guests. When she became ill, she was nursed by her husband for two years until she was taken to the hospital-home in July, 1940.

In addition to her husband, Mrs. Guth was survived by three sisters, Mrs. Minnie Crossall of Sandy Lake, Pa., Lilly and Josephine Tischendorf of Cincinnati, and many other relatives and friends.

Girl Soon Ends World's Cruise As Sail Handler

TORONTO, Ont.—(U.P.)—Nora Bailey, "able-bodied seaman" and graduate child psychiatrist, is on her way home after a 17-month-round-the-world voyage as a seaman on the sailing schooner Yankee. The 92-foot schooner has left Antigua, its last port of call before docking at its home port, Gloucester, Mass., where it is expected April 27, according to word reaching her father, A. H. Bailey, in Toronto.

The young Toronto girl signed on as an able-bodied seaman and has done her full share of sail handling and navigation. Miss Bailey was the only Canadian and except for the skipper's wife, the only woman aboard.

U. S. TRAINS YOUTHS FOR SEA



The United States Maritime Service is meeting the threatened shortage of skilled merchant seamen by training youths who have had no previous seagoing experience. Young American citizens in good physical condition 18 to 23 years of age are being enrolled for a seven months' course of instruction in the duties of the deck, engine, and steward departments. Enrollees are paid \$21.00 monthly, clothing, food, and quarters are furnished by the Government. The training course qualifies these young men for jobs on American merchant vessels where pay starts at \$72.50 a month with food and quarters furnished. For detailed information write to U. S. And he stood over her, and rebuked the fever; and it left her; and immediately she arose and ministered unto them." A passage from "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy states: "Do you say the time has not yet come in which to recognize Soul as substantial and able to control the body? Remember Jesus, who nearly nineteen centuries ago demonstrated the power of Spirit and said, 'He that believeth on me, the works that I do shall he do also; and who also said, 'But the hour cometh, and now is when the true worshippers shall worship the Father in spirit and in truth.'"
