And to a degree at least they are right. But if an older generation has erred, its sins have been those of omission, not commission. It fought valiantly against aggression in a World War, but let aggressor powers have the run of the roost in the ensuing years. It had a stake in peace but failed to see in time that other powers still had a stake in war and conquest.

Yet young Americans, now entering life on their own, find themselves in a country of living democracy, in a land where success and achievement are possible for all, under a flag where individual's right to speak, think and worship reigns unchallenged. There is a land of freedom favored above all others, a land worth loving and defending.
