County Counsel J. H. O'Connor advised the board of supervisors to deny the claim of Walter T. Paris for \$25 damages to a door, door jamb and a mirror, which were somewhat the worse for breakage after deputies got through operating with a pinch bar.



Delicious Meals on Economy Scale . . .

The need for economy is no handicap to the clever homemaker when it comes to serving good meals. She knows that some of the most delicious meals can be served at low cost when less demanded cuts of meat, rich in flavor and in food value but requiring a little longer time to cook, are used as the basis.

One of these cuts is brisket of beef. This is usually corned, but it is also good fresh. It's a great favorite in restaurants which specialize in good hearty food. It can be cooked just as successfully at home. Serve it with a tasty horseradish sauce.

### BEEF BRISKET WITH HORSE RADISH SAUCE

Select a three or four pound piece of fresh beef brisket. Cover with hot water. Season with salt and pepper. Cook at a simmering temperature three to four hours or until tender.

### Gauchos Have 11 Veterans on Football Team

Narbonne's Gauchos give every appearance — on the field or on the record book — of being one of the strongest contenders this year for the Marine League football championship. Last year they also started off that way but became bogged down with injuries. Coach Bill Sloan, now in his fourth year at the Lomita institution, declares he's not going to take "any chances" with smashing up his combination this year.

Nevertheless, he's going to take advantage of the bye date allowed the Gauchos on the opening of the League season Oct. 17. Sloan has three practice games booked, all of them on Griffin Field where the Gauchos will play all but their League games with San Pedro, Nov. 7 and Torrance, Nov. 14. His pre-season scrimmages are with South Gate, Oct. 3; Long Beach Poly Junior varsity, Oct. 10, and Loyola high of Los Angeles, Oct. 16. The Gauchos boast 10 lettermen and a transfer from Torrance who should stage a brother vs. brother battle when Narbonne and the Tartars tangle. He is Roland Justice, who won his letter last spring at Torrance in track and also played football, brother of Tom Justice, a Torrance end who is a letterman.

Coach Sloan is building his 1941 Gaucho squad around such veterans as Dick Mertz and Harry Alexander, quarterbacks; Bill Gibson, fullback; Ray Cheek left half; Maurice Binkley, Leroy Crow and Roland Justice, ends; James Asher and Gordon Millburn, tackles; Lonnie Bowman and Eddie Emrietta, guards, and Pat Huffine, center.

### Tartars Boast Heaviest Line in Grid History

Even a casual observer of grid practice these afternoons at Torrance high school field would get the idea that the Tartars' line has enough weight to stop a 10-ton tank. The same spectator would also learn that Coach Robert Barr, now in his fourth season at Torrance, is putting his 40 candidates thru some strenuous work in preparation for the opening of the Marine League football season just four weeks off.

It has been reported that the Tartar forward wall could tip the scales close to 1,450 pounds which means an average of about 200 pounds per man. That sounds incredible but you ought to see the beef that's trotting around the field these days.

However Coach Barr opines merely that he's got material for one good line and three or four substitutes. He's also equipped with nine lettermen and faces the League's strongest eleven for his first Marine game — San Pedro's rough-tough Buccaneers on Oct. 17.

In preparation for that struggle, Barr has scheduled two practice games—the first with Mt. Carmel here on Oct. 3 and the second at South Gate on Oct. 10. Barr is running his Tartars thru their warm-up pace along with Coach Pete Zamperini may find time from his launching of physical education classes and distribution of equipment later to assist with the direction of the 1941 squad.

Torrance will only participate in varsity games this season—no Class B or C teams being planned. The lettermen on deck for the campaign are: Bud Anderson, Chris Boglagis and Bob Golden, backfield; Ernest Banks, Dave Jacobs, Tom Justice, Dick Leech, Richard Thompson and Bill Wise.
