**PASTOR HERE TEN YEARS TOMORROW**

Ten years ago tomorrow (Friday) Rev. Frank D. Mechling was installed as pastor of the First Lutheran church here.

His and Mrs. Mechling's decade of splendid service to their congregation will not pass without an outstanding achievement because a month from today, on Sunday, Nov. 2, the new Lutheran church at the corner of Sonoma and Acacia aves., is scheduled for dedication.

The Mechlings came to Torrance Oct. 28, 1931 directly from Columbus, Ohio where he served as pastor of the Lutheran church for 13 1/2 years. They were married at Franklin, Ohio on Nov. 28, 1911—thus they will celebrate their 30th anniversary together next month.

**Line Between Living, Nonliving Matter Slight**

LOS ANGELES—The saying, "Ashes to ashes, dust to dust," is well-grounded in scientific theory, for the molecular biologist finds the line of demarcation between living and non-living matter a very thin and indefinite one.

So says Dr. O. L. Sponser, professor of botany, on the Los Angeles campus of the University of California, an outstand-

ing authority on the molecular structure of plant and animal life.

"In the world surrounding us we are prone to think of living organisms—plants and animals—as something imposed upon a non-living world. But the aged expression, 'Ashes to ashes, dust to dust' recognizes the origin and end of the living being and infers the relationship with non-living matter."

Dr. Sponser says that to the three classic divisions of matter on the earth: solid, liquid and gas, must be added a fourth: living matter. All four are made up of the same essential chemical elements but possess different arrangements of their mole-

cular structure.

He points out that oxygen is common to all four divisions—the atmosphere being mostly oxygen and nitrogen; the oceans being mostly oxygen and hydrogen; the land structures being mostly oxygen and silicon; and living matter being mostly oxygen and carbon.
