LEGION SONS SPURN SOVIET YOUTH BID

The Sons of the American Legion turned thumbs-down Saturday on an invitation by the Soviet Embassy in Washington to participate in sending messages to an "anti-Nazi youth meeting" in Moscow last Sunday, according to information received by local Sons officers.

"The Sons of the American Legion, with more than 500,000 members throughout the country, will not be duped into becoming affiliated with or cooperating with Communists or any other foreign-inspired youth movement," C. M. Wilson, national director of the Sons, said in answer to the invitation of D. Chuvahkin, first secretary of the U.S.S.R. Embassy.

Wilson said his organization was governed in policy by mandates of the American Legion and pointed out the Legion said by resolution in its recent Milwaukee convention its opposition to Communism remains unaltered.


