even until brown. Serve with cream sauce and parsley.

**Cheese Strata**  
12 slices day-old Weber bread  
1/2 lb. cheese  
2 1/2 cups Mayfair milk  
Salt and pepper  
Arrange 6 slices of bread (crusts trimmed) in the bottom of a baking dish, fitting them in so that four crusts surface is covered. Spread the bread with cheese, or slice it and cover the bread with it. Cover with remaining 6 slices of bread. Beat the eggs, add the milk and seasonings, and pour over the bread and cheese. Let stand an hour. Bake in a very moderate oven (325 degrees) about 40 minutes, or until puffed up and browned.

**Breaded Pork Chops**  
Add salt and pepper to slightly beaten eggs. Dip thick pork chops into finely rolled bread crumbs, flour egg and then into bread crumbs. Heat enough Crisco to cover bottom of pan generously and brown chops on both sides. Add one cup of milk, cover tightly, and place in oven. Bake from 30 to 45 minutes depending on thickness of chops—45 minutes if 2 inches thick. Small potatoes may be cooked with chops in the oven, also peas.

**Hot Water Pie Crust**  
1 1/2 cups Fisher Blend Flour

3/4 cup hot water  
1/4 teaspoon salt

Gordon made his letter there last year as a halfback and is on the starting lineup this fall where his experience is bolstering a green backfield. Speedy and deceptive, Gordon weighs 165 pounds. He is 20, a senior and president of the Block P club composed of men who have won their varsity letters at the college.


