post-graduate work at the Universities of Wisconsin and Southern California. He was an instructor at high schools at Hamlin and Corning, Kansas; Duncan, Arizona, Los Angeles and Gardena.

Staunch Isolationist  
From 1934 to 1938 he was a member of the California state assembly. He was first elected to Congress in 1938 and re-elected in 1940. In 1920 he married Nelle L. Cordts of Overbrook, Kansas, and he had two sons, Robert Lee, 17, and John J. Geyer, 15. Mr. Geyer succeeded the late Charles J. Colden, Democrat, who also died in office. Colden was the first man to serve in the re-appointed 17th District.

Following Mr. Geyer's first election, the Los Angeles board of education granted him a two-year leave of absence from his post as social science instructor at Gardena high school. After his re-election last November, the board declined to renew the leave but ruled that he could apply for re-instatement at any time.

Congressman Geyer was an ardent supporter of President Roosevelt's New Deal policies and backed the third term. However, he voted against many recent military and international measures on the ground they were leading the country into war. He was regarded as a staunch isolationist.

Governor's Tribute  
His death is at once a loss to the isolationist bloc of the House and to the supporters of the domestic — but not the international — policies of the President. Gov. Olson's tribute to the Congressman, sent to Mrs. Geyer in Washington last Saturday was:

"I have just learned of the passing of your husband. You have my deepest and most profound sympathy in your bereavement. Your loss is shared by the people of California and especially those of the 17th District, whom your husband so faithfully represented in our national Congress. The state has lost one of its most honored citizens."

approval, Dumbolton said.

Not Complete Restriction  
Prospective home builders should remember that the priority preference given defense workers in building and occupying homes does not mean that citizens residing in nondefense areas are to be restricted from building.

Paul L. Burkhard, president of the Building Contractors Association of California, declared that the purpose of the priority preference given defense workers is to help provide living quarters for men turning out the engines of war and not to prevent other citizens from building homes of their own.

"The priority system," he said "all springs from the fact that certain materials necessary in building a house also are necessary in making planes, tanks and guns. Priorities are a means of providing suitable homes for defense workers in spite of the fact that some building materials are needed in defense industry."

Plan Changes Will Help  
"Most of the critical materials are metal items, such as bathroom fixtures, stucco netting, nails." If any citizen can, thru his contractor, buy sufficient of these materials to build his house, there is absolutely no government restriction on his doing so, it is declared.

Many prospective home builders are solving their material problems by slight changes in plan," Burkhard said. "There is as yet no shortage and no priority control on lumber, brick and many other materials. Often the home builder can find a way to go ahead with his home by substituting other materials for scarce metal items. Sometimes the quality of the house is improved greatly by some such change."

Shaw, Clifton Hix, Assemblyman Vincent Thomas, L. A. City Councilman Wilder W. Hartley, Harbor Commissioner George Moore, Edward Means, John T. Rawls, Robert Hillyer, Mark Shaw, and A. Salagher.

Some party leaders are said to be opposed to calling an election on the grounds that any one elected would be a "baby Congressman" and as such would not be named on any important committees, and would have little voice in affairs at Washington. In the event the Governor decided to allow the vacancy to remain, the public would be saved the expense of an election, it is pointed out.
