**Any Yellow Star Thistles in Your Neighborhood?**

A new and serious noxious weed, yellow star thistle now is known to exist in 60 locations throughout the county. Attempts to eradicate the weed are under way under Becker's direction. Because of its tenacious habits the yellow star thistle has spread until it has become the most serious weed pest in several northern California counties.

The agricultural commissioner's office is desirous of having the public report locations within the county so that steps towards eradication may be started immediately. The plant grows five feet high under favored conditions but usually attains a height of only one or two feet. Flowers are yellow surrounded by several sharp spines.

**Keystone Sewer Bids Due Oct. 21**

Bids are to be opened Oct. 21 by the county board of supervisors for the Keystone project, estimated to cost \$3,022,500, and the work should get under way in November, according to word from the county engineer's department. The contract is scheduled to let one week after the bids are opened and it is thought that the work will start within 30 days after the contract award.

The area to be improved, known as County Improvement District No. 1034, was recently approved by the Board of Supervisors. The project has been urged by Keystone Chamber of Commerce for some time. Specifications call for installation of 1200 feet of eight-inch main line along 220th Street from Grabe Avenue to Avalon Boulevard connecting 345 feet of six-inch house pipe, construction of three manholes and one flushing manhole. The eight-inch line will empty into a main sewer on Main Street. Need of the improvement was recently stressed by health officials who stated that the area was in danger of becoming unsanitary during the rainy seasons.
