

STATE GUARD TO DRILL AT TORRANCE CITY PARK

Through arrangements made with Torrance city officials, permission to use Torrance park for drilling purposes has been granted Company H and buildings are being arranged for the safe storage of guns and other equipment. As soon as the building is ready the equipment for the company will be sent. A large number of men drilled at the park Sunday morning, including a unit of auxiliary men under 18 years of age. These boys will be admitted to the company when they reach 18. Men reporting for drill will go to the north entrance of Torrance park. Drilling is still being held each Wednesday night at 7:30 p.m. and perhaps on Sunday mornings. A room at the park is being fitted up for an office and men can enlist there on drill nights, Dr. T. W. Bullock says.

Dicalite Tunnel Not Available For Raid Shelter

A report in last week's issue that a tunnel at the Dicalite plant near Welteria would make a good air raid shelter was a bit premature, this newspaper learned Monday from C. W. Hooper, superintendent of the plant. "There is a tunnel here but it has not been used for about the past five years and has been abandoned," Hooper said. "It is not timbered and is badly caved in. I would say that only about one-quarter of a mile of its mile length is open. In this condition it is more dangerous than the outside. We would welcome any authorized Civilian Defense agency that wanted to fix it up and make it habitable in case of an emergency," Hooper continued. "This would require considerable work. I believe the tunnel could be made safe for an air raid shelter but I don't want the impression to get around that it is available at the present time in its decidedly unsafe condition."

All citizens of Torrance are requested to get behind this program, and all factories and business establishments should be impressed with the importance of conserving waste paper. Waste Paper Dealers and Charities are urged to put on a greater drive for collecting more waste paper. Boy Scouts, Sons of Legionnaires, Catholic Salvage, the American Legion Auxiliary, and other similar organizations should be stimulated to much greater effort. Tom F.
