

Students Show Keen Interest In Jr. Red Cross

A review of the activities of the Junior Red Cross units in Torrance schools during the 1941-42 term, compiled by Miss Ada M. P. Chase, high school chairman, shows that the youngsters gave considerable time and attention to the work. The various projects listed by Miss Chase were:

At the Elementary schools, where Mrs. Clara Pierce is sponsor for the Torrance Elementary, Miss Ruth Townner directs the activities at the Fern Avenue school and Mrs. Reed has charge of the work at the Carson Street school.

Many students have learned to knit and worked on knitted squares for afghans; made jigsaw puzzles for incapacitated service men; collected tin foil and rag bag sacks; given demonstrations and talks on first aid; made baby blankets, snow suits, nightgowns, towels and Christmas boxes and place cards for underprivileged children.

Raise Red Cross Funds

The high school chapter has: Donated \$18 to Red Cross service fund, and \$21.65 to the Red Cross War Fund; collected books for the U.S.O.; conducted a metal and paper salvage drive; tabulated all coats and blankets available in the Torrance schools; made jigsaw puzzles; card table covers, sofa pillows, lap boards, checker boards for hospital and U.S.O. use; made small children's dresses and aprons, dolls and joll cradles for children in hospitals.

Seventh grade pupils have earned to knit and have knitted and made up a news-paper blanket which was exhibited in the "Made-from-Salvage" exhibit at the Board of Education headquarters in the Chamber of Commerce Building last May.

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6000 L. A Teachers Share in Earnings

Semi-annual dividends totaling \$242,000 was distributed July 1 to more than 12,000 Coast Federal Savings Account holders. This marked the conclusion of one of the most successful six months periods in Coast Federal's history, according to Joe Crail, president.

In addition to distributing this amount in dividends, the association set aside in reserves approximately five times the sum that Federal regulations require. Thus, today, Coast Federal has \$1,222,000.00 in reserves and surplus. This represents an increase of 49.5 per cent over the amount in reserves and surplus as of June 30, 1941. Total reserves and surplus are 6.9 per cent of the total assets, and 8.6 per cent of the total share accounts.

During the six months period, Jan. 1 to June 30, 1942, a total of 92 lion skins have been turned into the State Division of Fish and Game for bounty. Forty-eight females were killed and forty-four males. A bounty of \$30 was paid on each female and \$20 on each male. The lion kill for this year is far below that for the same period during 1941, when 146 was the reported kill to June 30.
