Until the vacancy created by Stansbury's resignation can be filled by civil service examination, the position is being temporarily filled by Paul Skoog, sanitary inspector in the Inglewood district.

Names of those who are accepted for Army service will be published by this newspaper next week, the complete roster having been reported in last week's issue.

One of the inductees who left yesterday was a grandfather whose son was inducted into the Army last Jan. 17. He was Russell Knapp, now a resident of Compton, who worked for the Columbia Steel for 10 years and for C.C.M.O. for seven years. Knapp is 42. His son, Harry, is a corporal. Another son has a 10-month-old boy. Knapp, however, was rejected at the induction center.

The trip to the Los Angeles induction station was the third one for Harris Grothman of South Gate and Raymond F. Spehger, 1307 Portola ave. They were rejected on two previous inductions.

Sergeant Elmer F. Hiatt of 2431 280th st., Lomita, left in his California State Guard uniform and Vernon B. Darton of Los Angeles left with the aid of a pair of crutches. He had recently injured his left foot. Two of the oldest men in the contingent were Wesley Page, 45, of Gardena, and Ralph Johnson, 43, of Lomita.

Sample Ballot Mailing to Cost \$25,000 Postage
Postage—\$25,000 worth—was authorized this week by the board of supervisors for mailing sample ballots for the August primary election.

The sample ballots, which will be the voter's preview of the official list of candidates he may vote to place in public office, will be mailed early this month, according to Registrar of Voters, Michael J. Donoghue.

Cost of mailing the ballots is one cent each, and about 1,600,000 will be mailed this year.

Bomb-Prepared Homes Here Receiving Honor Certificates

Special honor certificates are beginning to appear in the windows of many homes in Torrance and within the next few weeks the number will be increased four-fold, Mayor Tom McGuire, chairman of the local Defense Council, said this week.

The certificates, printed in red and blue on white paper, are adorned with a large civilian defense insignia surmounted by the slogan "We are Prepared." They are issued by the State Council of Defense.

Only homes which meet all of the requirements for adequate home protection in case of bombing raids are entitled to display the stickers. They are issued only by neighborhood air raid wardens after homes pass their official inspection.

Since being received, more than 100 certificates have been issued, and with the "We are Prepared" program under way, the demand is steadily increasing.

Also no criticism should be directed against persons who do not have a certificate in the windows of their homes, the same tolerance will not be displayed in the near future. There will be no official action on the part of the local defense council to force laggards into line, but it is highly probable that neighborhood opinion will be an influence that cannot be disregarded by home owners who fail to cooperate in the home protection program.
