**Housewives Up Collections of Waste Grease**

Praise of Southland housewives who are salvaging waste fats from the kitchen was sounded today by Zack J. Farmer, general salvage chief of the War Production Board, as he reported that May collections in the Southern California counties were 374,507 pounds, a gain of 76,508 pounds over the April total.

Torrance housewives turned in 596 pounds while Lomitas contributed 615 pounds. Harbor City folks added 58 pounds to the total.

"This improvement indicates that housewives who are saving waste kitchen fats are really doing a fine job," says Farmer. "Their contributions to the national supply were over 25 per cent greater in May than the month before, and brought our area's total up to 52 per cent of our quota."

"Surveys indicate that too many housewives who have grease are not saving it for bullets," continued Farmer, urging that every housewife consider her personal responsibility in the drive for explosives.
