RATIONING TIME TABLE

RED STAMPS—(for meat, canned fish, canned milk, most edible oils and cheeses). Stamps T, U, V and W good through Aug. 31. Stamp X good now through Oct. 2; Stamp Y good Aug. 29 through Oct. 2; Stamp Z good Sept. 5 through Oct. 2.

WAR RATION BOOK 3

BROWN stamps—for meat, canned fish, most edible oils, cheeses and canned milk:
 A good Sept. 12 through Oct. 2
 B good Sept. 19 through Oct. 2
 C good Sept. 26 through Oct. 30
 D good Oct. 3 through Oct. 30
 E good Oct. 10 through Oct. 30
 F good Oct. 17 through Oct. 30.

BLUE STAMPS—(for canned, frozen and certain dehydrated foods. Stamps R, S and T valid through Sept. 20. Stamps U, V, P, W good Sept. 2 through Oct. 20.

SUGAR—Stamp 14, 15 and 16, each good for 5 pounds of sugar through Oct. 31.

SHOES—Stamp 18 good for one pair through Oct. 31.

GASOLINE—

COUPON NO. 7 (A-Book)—All old-style B and C coupons which read "good for one unit of gasoline" must be exchanged at local ration boards for new style coupons before Sept. 1.

All new style coupons, A, B and C, must be endorsed on file with car license number and state of registration.

TIRE INSPECTION—"B" book cars, next tire inspection deadline, Oct. 31 and every 4 months thereafter; "C" book cars, next tire inspection deadline Aug. 31 and every 3 months thereafter. "A" book cars, next tire inspection deadline Sept. 30 and every 6 months thereafter.

RATION BOARD OFFICE HOURS—At 2300 Carson st., daily from 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Service Men's War Ration Book Status Defined by Price Board

Eligibility of members of the armed forces for War Ration Book 3 is defined in an amendment issued by the Office of Price Administration. Under this amendment, the general test to be applied in determining eligibility for War Ration Book 3 is whether the serviceman customarily needs ration stamps or coupons to meet his regular food requirements. As worked out by O.P.A. with the War and Navy departments, the eligibility tests are stated as follows:

War Ration Book 3 may be issued to any member of the armed forces of the United States, or of the United Nations, who is not in one of the following classes:

- (1) Substituted or authorized to be substituted in kind; or
- (2) A member of a mess where the rationed foods used are acquired by the use of ration checks issued by the Army, Navy, Marine Corps or Coast Guard, or by an officer authorized to issue such checks; or
- (3) Although not substituted in kind and not a member of such mess, eats at least 14 meals a week at a mess of that type.

Procedure is set up in the amendment whereby servicemen who become eligible to use ration stamps after Sept. 1 may apply to the local War Price and Rationing Board for Book 3. Commanding officers will issue eligibility certificates for such applicants.

No Shoe Coupons
 The amendment also provides that "airplane" stamps numbered 1 through 4 in Book 3, which have been set aside for use in the shoe rationing program, will be removed from copies of the book issued to members of the armed forces. O.P.A. explained that servicemen and women do not need regular ration currency to buy shoes. They can obtain shoes or shoe purchase certificates from their respective branches of the services.

Eligible members of the armed forces of the United States and of the United Nations on duty in this country will apply during the next ten days for War Ration Book 3—a replacement book containing ration currency to be used as the stamps in current ration books run out. Application blanks, which may be obtained from commanding officers at posts or stations of duty, must be mailed to the O.P.A. mailing center at Chicago on or before Aug. 31. Books will be distributed to qualified applicants before mid-September, the earliest time at which they will be needed for the purchase of rationed commodities.

Dogs Wanted for Training as Aides To Blind Persons



Sweeping Control on Prices for Auto Parts Goes In Effect Sept. 2

Another step aimed to "hold the line" by the Office of Price Administration will become effective on Sept. 2, when every level of the automobile parts industry will be brought under one or two companion price ceilings regulations. These are aimed to continue in effect the March 1942 prices for every division of the trade from manufacturer to retailer and will affect not only new parts, but rebuilt or used automotive parts as well. This sweeping ruling which will affect every motorist in this area was announced today by Sam Leask, Jr., O.P.A. chief for nine southern California counties.

March '42 Prices Prevail

It brings under a specific price ceiling the wholesalers, jobbers, retailers and authorized retail outlets, as well as concerns which rebuild automobile parts and dealers in used parts. This is accomplished by one of the two new regulations, and, in each case, prices are set at the figures which would have prevailed at such levels in March of 1942, allowing the same markups over manufacturers' prices as existed then. These are established from factory printed price lists of that date, or lists issued subsequently, with O.P.A. approval.

"When the new order becomes effective, every firm handling automobile parts will be required to file with the Office of Price Administration its ceiling prices on every item in stock," said Leask. "This means that any buyer can check whether the figure charged is correct by getting in touch with the enforcement division of O.P.A."

"An idea of its magnitude is obtained if considered that it affects directly every car or truck owner, as well as 2500

manufacturers, 9000 wholesalers, 44,000 automobile dealers, over a quarter million independent garages and service stations, 60,000 repair and service outlets and many thousands of dealers in used auto parts. In normal years, these had an annual business in excess of \$30,000,000."
