## Plans Completed for First Annual Torrance Rodeo Show Next Sunday

der way with the first event, Brahma bull riding, at 1 o'clock in the afternoon.

While in San Diego last weekend, Callihan secured the services of Jeff Kell, famous rodeo clown, who will perform with his highly educated mule during the afternoon. In addition there will be a fine exhibition by Patsy North riding her educated horse, Rex. This horse is uncanny in the manner in which he obeys commands, performs unbelievable stunts and feats of memory and also shows just what a good horse can be taught.

Riders have already started to come in for the show. Lou Phillips, Ray Carroll and J. Mehl, ranch boss at the Palos Verdes Estates, all well-known calf ropers, have signed up, and many a good cowhand will be filling out his entry blank before the day is over.

Early Sunday morning a cavalcade of trucks will draw up at the park, and the 20 outlaw bucking horses, bareback broncs and Brahma bulls, all wild as the country from which they originally sprung, and ten unruly longhorn steers will be unloaded and placed under care of expert cowhands by George Demere, who is known throughout the West for his wild and untamed aggregation of bucking stock.

Two horses that have made things mighty tough for the rodeo performers throughout California and the West in the past year, "Flying Devil" and "Sky Rocket," will be herded into a special pen and given an extra shot of oats, because the rodeo managers, Callihan and Rivers, have agreed to ride them in an exhibition that bids fair to be a surprise event.

Demere says the boys will be bucked off Callihan who is known through this area as the bronc-busting bus driver from the plains of Nevada, insists that "sit'n so," while Rivers, who performed for years on the Western rodeo circuit, opines that even though he has been out of practice for six years, he will ride that bronc or else. Well, these are things that fate will decide come Sunday.

In addition to the bareback riding, an entirely different type of event from bronc riding, the cowboys will ride bulls, rope calves, bulldog the wild longhorns and in general make this a truly Western holiday for the throng that from all indications, will jam the gates of the park to see the initial offering of the rodeo committee.

Preceding the start of the show sale of War Bonds will be stimulated. Booths for this purpose will be set up near the

show grounds. The rodeo committee declares each and every person who buys a War Bond between the hours of 11 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Sunday, a ticket of admission to this Western exhibition will be given absolutely free.

"Just tell the folks, that we are going to put on a show they'll never forget. It's been a hard job, but we have made it, and no one is going to get disappointed at the park Sunday," Callihan insisted, as he skillfully piloted the first bus out of Los Angeles this morning loaded with workers in Torrance defense plants. Callihan is the only remaining member of a capable crew of drivers that started out with the Torrance Municipal Bus Line when the organization started functioning. He is a good driver, too, even though he does go in strong for horses.
