

Big Scale Public Works Held No Solution of Post-War Employment

Alden C. Fensel, director of research of the California Taxpayers Assn., contends that large scale public construction, regardless of need, will bring no solution of California's employment problems after the war.

Construction of public works, Fensel points out, requires craftsmen skilled in building activities and it was found, for example, during the large scale program initiated in the 1930's that there were a limited number of workers in this field.

In this connection, records of the state department of employment were cited, showing an average of 1,384,000 workers listed for unemployment insurance purposes in 1940, and only 10 per cent of that number worked in the construction field or its allied industries.

Declaring there is considerable confusion in thinking evidenced in many public expressions relative to post-war employment, both with respect to job opportunity and the number to be employed, the analyst said the plans should take into account the return of workers from war industries to the group "normally not in the labor force." These include:

Young people of school age including high school, junior college and college, many of


who are working part-time but are included in the reported total of employment as full-time persons.

Women with young children. Married and financially independent women who are making sacrifices by working in war industries.

The elderly who would normally have discontinued working but are doing their best to help the war effort.
