McCall Guilty, Pays Club Five Dollars as Fine

City Attorney John McCall was convicted Monday night of failing to make good a bet that Jack Barrington, president of the Kiwanis club, would not deliver the invocation at the installation of club officers last January. The jury of 108 found that Barrington did, in fact, deliver the invocation and Judge Charles Bunnell of Los Angeles, who presided at the trial, fined McCall \$5, which was paid.

Judge Frank Carrell of Gardena was among an array of legal talent present for the trial, as a character witness for McCall, as was Judge LeRoy Dawson of Los Angeles. Prosecuting McCall was District Attorney Fred N. Howser.

The courtroom—the Torrance Men's Bible Class hall—was filled. It was the largest dinner meeting in the history of the Kiwanis club here. Delegates were present from the Lomita Kiwanis club, the Torrance Rotary club and others from nearby cities.

A cell had been built to detain McCall during the proceedings. His dinner was served in the enclosure. In one respect the prisoner had the better of the others present—he had elbow room.

Sport Highlights

Paced by Bill George, who gamered 12 points, the Torrance High track squad defeated the San Pedro boys by a 21 point margin last Friday.

To start the scoring, the Tartars swept the high barriers, with George first, Long second and Jim Post third. The 100 was very close, having Bob Leech and Bud Hays hitting the tape at the same instant, while Lloyd Warthan was hot on their trail.

Storey of San Pedro won the 220, leaving Leech and Kent second and third respectively. Warthan again came through with a triumph in the 440, letting Beausang and Gus Bray follow him across the line.

For the first time this year the Tartars failed to sweep the 880, having their record broken by Maier, but Kent and Poh took first and third respectively. Don Billhardt won the low sticks from George, while Gude of S. P. came in third.

Jim Post pushed the shot over 42 feet for first in the event, with Crisa and Leech coming in second and third, having slightly shorter heaves.

Many Ties The pole vault was filled with ties, Dallas Martin and Wohlers first, then "Gordo" Smith and Billhardt third. When Maier of Pedro went out, Bill George and Ed Robst, both Tartars, decided to let the high jump stand at a tie, each having cleared 5 ft. 9. Maier, San Pedro's high point man, won the broad jump with a leap of 21 ft. 5 1/2, outjumping Darpinian and Robst, who took second and third respectively.

This was the first Tartar victory over the Pirates in nearly seven years and the fellows are now aiming for the league championship.
