State Guard Gets Rifles From Army

All companies of the 2nd Battalion, 39th Regiment, California State Guard, have been equipped with U. S. rifles, .30 calibre, as well as with Thompson sub-machine guns, Maj. A. Milton Fish, commanding officer of the battalion announced yesterday. The U. S. rifles were furnished by the Army, which also has provided complete uniforms and field equipment for the State Guard companies.

Summer sultan uniforms have been provided by the Army for State Guard troops and are now being issued, Maj. Fish said.

Company H, 2nd Battalion, Torrance-Lomita, was inspected by staff officers during the week, the major announced. Inspecting officers were Capt. Clarence L. Johnson, battalion executive officer, and 1st Lt. George L. Maitrejean, battalion adjutant.

The State Guard, being federally sponsored and equipped, are required to meet the standards fixed by the War Department National Guard bureau as well as the state regulations of the Adjutant General's office," Major Fish said.

Being in frequent operation with the U. S. Army troops, the State Guard troops must meet similar rigid inspection.

Officers of the 2nd Battalion will join those of the 9th Tactical Command, headed by Col. John C. French, the 9th Region, and those of the 126th U. S. Cav. Resn. Sq. (Mech.) in a dinner on Thursday evening, May 11, in the Pacific Coast club.

All State Guard company officers are being invited to the dinner to discuss tactical problems with the U. S. Army command in defense of this area.

The troops of the 2nd Battalion companies will meet in joint exercises, maneuvers and a review on Sunday, May 21, in Torrance city park. The exercises will continue from 9 a. m. to 5 p. m.

There are nine companies in the battalion.
