Instead, a ration value based on the available supply has been worked out. This item, therefore, still calls for the consumer to surrender ration points with each purchase.

Garden Grams

Tomato Rust Mite

A microscopic mite sucks the sap causing a greasy brown discoloration or rusting of leaves and stems. Damage first appears at the base of the plant and progresses upward. Defoliation of the plant is followed by subburning of the fruit. Control by application of dusting sulphur. Start application when plants are three to four weeks old. Repeat in three weeks and for the balance of the season at monthly intervals. Dust before injury appears—the insect and the first damage can not be seen without a microscope. Wash off sulphur residue before using tomatoes.

Potato Harvesting

Extend the usefulness of your potato planting. Dig alternate plants in the row rather than entire row or section of row. If the soil is soft, especially following an irrigation, you will find you can locate larger potatoes by working through the soft soil with your hands and twist them off the roots with little or no injury to the plant. Smaller potatoes will continue to grow. When the old tops brown and dry stop watering and dig within two weeks. Potatoes will then be mature and will keep best.

Onions

When onion seedstalks start, cutting off the seedstalk, rolling the top, etc., will not stop the tendency to "go to seed" because a physiological change has already taken place in the center of the bulb. The bulb will never make a suitable dry onion, but should be used for green onions or for creaming and seasoning. Never roll or break over the tops of onions for that matter. The practice will not induce development of the bulb and is both injurious and unnecessary. When bulbs are mature, tops will naturally break. Stop watering for ten days to three weeks, depending on the soil. Then dig, cure and store.

Mildew

What is mildew? Circular patches of white powdery growth appearing on leaves and stems. Leaves will wrinkle and become distorted, turn brown and die. Beans, peas, squash, onions will all suffer and can be treated with sulphur dust. Melons and cucumbers will likewise be affected but must be sprayed with yellow copper oxide. Many ornamentals are affected also.

Sugar Stamp 32 Good June 16; Canning Changed

Sugar stamp 32 in War Ration Book Four will become good for an indefinite period on June 16 for five pounds of sugar.

"This validation continues distribution of sugar to household consumers at the same rate as before," said Frank W. Daniels, Torrance Ration Board chief clerk, "five pounds per person for every two and one-half months."

Most timely of the week's food rationing items was an announcement Monday that there has been a relaxation in the rules affecting sugar for home canning. Housewives were previously asked to apply for half of their 20 pound home canning supply before July 15 and the other half afterwards. Because fruit crops mature early in some parts of the country, OPA has a new rule which allows the housewife to apply for her full 20 pounds on or after June 16. At the same time, she should advise her OPA board when making such an application that early fruits she plans to can.

Sorry this letter is late, but I'm up to my ears in the 5th War Loan Drive.

As head of the town's committee, I'm busy almost every waking moment selling bonds. This is, by all odds, the most critical period of the war. Everything is at stake—everything. (As if I needed to tell you that.) Our quota calls for two billion dollars more in this loan than the last—everyone got to buy two or three times more than his ever bought before—if things are to go as we solemnly pray they should.

Thank God most of the people I talk to seem to realize the critical need. They do without things they actually need in order to plunk down another hundred or two. I guess they feel as I do. With a man you love over there, the least you can do is your utmost.

I want you to know, Jim, that the folks here at home are with you—and their money is fighting with you—every last dollar they can scrape up. Mother and I send love.
