## Missionary From China Will Speak

Modern miracles of answered prayer will highlight the thrilling story to be told Sunday by Rev. A. K. Reiton in a special service in Central Evangelical Community church, Torrance. The guest minister, who had served for 34 years as a missionary in Hong Kong, China, was caught in the Japanese invasion of that city during which more than 200,000 persons were slain. Slain and starved bodies were stacked at the very door behind which he and his family were hiding in darkness for 46 days.

Announcing the Rev. Mr. Reiton's service, the Rev. H. Wesley Roloff said:

"During this awful ordeal, doctors, nurses and British soldiers were bayoneted on every side. There were dreadful days and nights of screaming and crashing bombs and shells. Day after day soldiers searched every room of the building in which they were hiding but not once entered their particular room. The Reitons attribute this deliverance directly to answered prayer. Later, they were directed by God to surrender to the Japanese. This was accomplished in a most thrilling way. After having spent 154 days behind barbed wire in a Japanese prison camp, they learned the heartening news that they were to be returned to America on the Gripsholm."

Reverend and Mrs. Reiton are the founders and the superintendents of the South China Paniel Mission. Since their return to the United States, thousands have thrilled and wept to the gripping story of this man of God as it has been told across the country.

The service is to be Sunday, March 18th at 2:30 p. m. This is the only service at which Rev. Mr. Reiton is to speak in Torrance. Central church is located at the corner of Marcellina ave. and Arlington. In the regular morning service the Rev. Mr. Roloff will speak on the subject, "The Judgment of this World." The pastor's evening topic will be: "When Christ Is Silent."

**RIBBON CEREMONY**

Under old English law, if the free use of a pathway through privately owned land was not protected over a period of years, the pathway became a legal public thoroughfare. Estate owners, to protect property rights, on occasion would stretch a ribbon across traveled pathways, then villagers would cut the ribbon with the landowner's consent and continue to use the pathway.
