

Local Girl Helps Keep 'Home Fires' Burning at WAC Mess Overseas

Corp. Joyce Farquhar, daughter of Mrs. Jack Kesson of Torrance, has one of the most unique jobs in the entire Far East Air Service Command, Women's Army Corps, detachment.

This diminutive enlisted woman literally keeps the "Home Fires Burning" for the WAC detachment, a unit of Air Wacs sent overseas to assist in this tremendous job. The field range gasoline stoves used by all units in the field are a headache to keep in operation and highly inflammable, unless properly adjusted. The repair work was previously done by a skilled mechanic, who was burned severely in an explosion. The call for a replacement was sent out, but none was found.

The cooks were in a quandary as to how they would prepare the WAC mess, until Corporal Farquhar volunteered her services. Unskilled in the mechanism of gasoline stoves, she began experimenting, and having a natural aptitude for machinery she was soon an expert in repair and maintenance. She explained, "you just have to tinker carefully to keep the flame burning" — Sweltering in the heat of the tropical sun she smiles while she works despite the added discomfort of working all day over a gas flame.

Corporal Farquhar enlisted in the WAC in Feb. 1943, received her basic training at Fort Des Moines, Iowa, attending cooks and bakers school and served as a cook until she took over her present job. She was sent to Craig Field, Ala., remained there 14 months and then was sent overseas. She arrived in New Guinea in Oct. 1944. She wears the good conduct ribbon, Asiatic Pacific ribbon and the WAC service ribbon.

played as a power machine operator for Scemers Mfg., Los Angeles, Calif., before her enlistment. Her sister, S/Sc, Gloria Noble is in the WAVE and her brother, Robert Noble, is in the merchant marine.

Cafeteria Shift In Schools to Affect Torrance

Acting to forestall the closing of about 25 elementary school cafeterias, the Board of Education has moved to take over and operate Los Angeles school feeding system, including 71 high schools and 189 elementary cafeterias.

The new policy will not be effective immediately as existing contracts for supplies are in the of the Los Angeles City Schools Cafeteria Association, Inc., a non-profit organization. However, the board empowered Supt. Vierling Kersey to pool the cafeteria's reserve and surplus funds as the first step toward centralization of the system.

According to Principal Harold Perry, of Torrance high school, no official word of the change has been received here, but he contemplates that the high school cafeteria, now under management of the Student Body Association, will be shifted to school management in September.

Likewise, the elementary school cafeteria also will be shifted, it was said.

Independent Bank Resources Show Big Gain

Resources of 67 community-owned banks in Southern California increased \$204,876,792.51 in 1944, according to a survey prepared by the Independent Bankers Assn., of Southern California and made public yesterday by James W. Post, president of the Torrance National Bank, which institution is a member of the association.

Combined resources of these banks stood at \$981,390,792.51, as of Dec. 31, 1944, as compared with \$776,514,000 12 months previous, a gain of over 26 per cent for the period.

War bond sales to the public of this group of community banks during the Sixth War Loan totaled \$75,588,450 or over 16 per cent of Southern California's over-all quota of \$451,000,000, the report showed. These sales represented an 18 per cent increase over the sales of these banks in the Fifth War Loan.

"Today all banks are faced with the serious problem of maintaining efficient service to depositors in view of the present manpower situation and our great increase in assets," Mr. Post said. "In addition, many hours of time of our staff have been contributed to the sale of war bonds without any compensation for the time or cost involved, but this and other war-time services are cheerfully rendered by our institutions as by every other patriotic business firm and individual. We are proud of the part which community banks are playing in the over-all war effort."


