

Annual B.P.O.E. Convention Is Called Off

The annual B. P. O. Elks Grand Lodge convention, scheduled to be held in New York City next July, has been cancelled in order to comply with the recent request of the War Mobilization Director, David E. Proctor, exalted ruler of Redondo Beach Lodge No. 1378 announced today.

Proctor quoted from a letter received from Dr. Robert South Barrett of Alexandria, Va., grand exalted ruler of the nationwide fraternity, in which he said: "I am advising the 700,000 members of the 1400 Elk lodges throughout the country that the grand exalted ruler and the board of grand trustees have ordered the suspension of the 1945 Grand Lodge session which we planned to hold in New York City in July. This decision was made in order to comply with the recent request of War Mobilization Director James F. Byrnes, that all gatherings of more than 50 people be suspended for the duration. This is the first time in the 77 year history of the B. P. O. Elks that a grand lodge session has been suspended, but we feel that it is our patriotic duty to cooperate with all government authorities engaged in shortening and winning the war."

Dr. Barrett also said that all state Elks associations have been instructed to refrain from holding meetings that are not strictly in line with the letter and spirit of Mr. Byrnes' request.
