Pfc. Pope Wins Distinguished Flying Cross

Pfc. James L. Pope, aerial radio operator, of 2085 Lomita blvd., Lomita, Calif., has been awarded a Distinguished Flying Cross, it was announced by Brig. Gen. William H. Turner, commanding general of the India-China Division, Air Transport Command.

The award was made upon completion of 300 hours of operational flight in transport aircraft over the dangerous and difficult India-China air routes, where enemy interception and attack was probable and expected.

The air trail over the Hump, famed route through the towering peaks of the Himalaya Mountains, blazed by the Air Transport Command, is recognized by airmen as the world's toughest. Today the Hump route is the main lifeline of vital military supplies for the Allied forces fighting the Japanese in China.

The citation accompanying the award adds:
"Flying at night as well as by day, at high altitudes over impassable, mountainous terrain through areas characterized by extremely treacherous weather conditions necessitating long periods of operation on instruments... requiring courageous and superior performance of his duties to overcome, he accomplished his mission with distinction."
