

# 100 Percent Synthetic Rubber Tires Seen For Future By Akron Interests

Predictions from Akron, Ohio, long the rubber tire capital of the world, that motorists eventually may be riding on 100 percent synthetic rubber which can be produced for as low as 10 cents a pound has given further support to reports that the group of four synthetic plants in Torrance will operate permanently.

They are the Dow Chemical Co., Shell Chemical Co., Good-year Synthetic Rubber Co. and U. S. Rubber Co.

The seventy million passenger car tires that leaders of the tire business expect to produce in 1948 and again in 1947 will vary anywhere from 50 to 85 percent synthetic with the rest natural. Production is expected to drop back to 62,000,000 in 1948 in line with demand.

These figures are bigger than the industry has ever known. In 1941 the output reached 53,000,000 against a previous all time high in 1929 of 61,000,000.

The industry today is in a happy situation except for a labor situation involving the present six-hour day and union demands of a 30-hour week and a 30 cents an hour pay increase with 10 cents extra for night work with double pay for holidays, it was said in Akron.

The happy end of the situation is that as much as 300,000 tons of crude rubber have been found in one-time Jap occupied

areas in the Far East, most of it in Indo-China. The first exports into the raw rubber area reported that not over 2 per cent of the trees had been damaged and that due to a long rest they probably would produce more than ever before.

These facts came from top executives of the four biggest tire manufacturers in the rubber capital of the world. The statements were made to 16 newspaper reporters who have inspected industrial concerns in an effort to learn about the progress of reconversion.
