RESOLUTION NO. 1533 RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE, CALIFORNIA, CALLING, PROVIDING FOR AND GIVING NOTICE OF A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD JANUARY 15, 1946 WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT NO. 1 OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE AS DESCRIBED HEREIN AND PROVIDING FOR THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF SAID DISTRICT OF INCURRING A DEBT BY THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS OF SUCH DISTRICT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$150,000.00 TO PAY THE COSTS AND EXPENSES OF ACQUIRING AND CONSTRUCTING WATER WORKS FOR SAID DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, the hearing provided for in said ordinance was duly held and regularly held at the time and place fixed therefor and no protests or objections have been made and the City Council at the time and place fixed for said hearing took evidence upon the allegations of the petition and that all the property in the district would be benefited by the proposed water works described in said ordinance and upon all other matters upon which evidence is necessary, and the City Council of said city has acquired jurisdiction to proceed further in accordance with the provisions of said act;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Torrance, California, does hereby resolve, determine and order as follows: Section 1. That a special election be held and the same is hereby called and ordered to be held on Tuesday, January 15, 1946, within Municipal Water District No. 1 of the City of Torrance, the exterior boundaries of which district are described in said ordinance of intention and hereinafter set forth, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of said district the proposition of incurring a debt by the issuance of bonds of said district in the amount of one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000.00) for the purposes set forth in said ordinance of intention and hereinafter stated.

Section 2.
