He will install a bailer there and at the end of the month's trial, he will either withdraw or make a deal with the city for a permanent operation. The council also voted funds to fence the dump.

North Torrance Water Petitions Filed; Hollywood Riviera Cost Given

Petitions for the establishment of a water district in North Torrance were filed with City Clerk A. H. Bartlett Tuesday and he reported to the City Council that he will check the names of some 70 signers against the great register before reporting on their sufficiency at the next meeting.
Residents of the district have asked that the boundary of the district be fixed to include all area in North Torrance north of 190th st., except that included in A. and I. district No. 1, and an area one-fourth mile south of 190th st. from Crenshaw blvd. to Hawthorne blvd.
There is sufficient assessed valuation in this area to properly finance the distribution of water to North Torrance with a grid system providing pipe lines about one half mile apart.
Meanwhile, Bartlett reported that the water engineering firm of Taylor & Taylor had completed a survey of Hollywood

Riviera section of Torrance, finding that the area will stand a bond issue of \$165,000 to finance a water system for that area.
A joint movement with the Waveria water district to bring Metropolitan Water District supply to Hollywood Riviera would be provided under plans, city officials said.
The City Council authorized City Clerk Bartlett to prepare necessary petitions to call for formation of the district.
Walteria and other Southwest Torrance residents formed a district some weeks ago, bonding themselves to the extent of some \$155,000 to pay for the water system.
