

**Open House At Torrance Health Center Wednesday; Public Invited**

Final plans for open house in the Torrance health center, 2300 Carson st., to which the public is invited next Wednesday afternoon have been completed, according to Dr. H. C. Smiley, Torrance district health officer, when public health nurses and their work in the community will be featured in conjunction with Public Health Nurses' week to be observed nationally April 7-13.

Public health nurses from the schools, insurance companies, the Los Angeles county health department, and the Visiting Nurses' association will be on hand to conduct guests through the health center and explain the various public health activities.

Among the services which will be demonstrated in the clinics will be treatment of venereal disease, child hygiene and prenatal conferences, chest examinations and disease prevention.

Mrs. Gladys T. Pearce, supervising public health nurse for the district has arranged to have health education films shown during the afternoon. The first showing will be at 2 p.m., and will be repeated at 3 and 4 o'clock, with the Wm. Disney technicolor film, "Defense Against Invasion" featured.
