Torrance WAA Center Does Big Business

A million dollar business was the sales record of the War Assets Administration on the first day of a \$5,000,000 war surplus disposal sale which opened Wednesday, March 27, at the agency's first "one-stop" display-sales center in Torrance, according to announcement by Serge F. Ballif, Jr., regional WAA director.

Stocks at the center, which occupies buildings of the former Aluminum Company of America at 180th street and Normandie avenue, Torrance, were inspected by 1,000 persons on the sale opening day.

Ballif reported surplus capital and producers' goods valued at more than \$10,000,000 now is stored at the center but said the inventory changes daily as deliveries are made to purchasers and additional material arrives from Los Angeles area war plants. Purchasers of most items may complete all details of purchase transactions in one visit to the center—save the items for sale, pay for those wanted and make arrangements for delivery, Ballif said.

Buyers from 60 Southern California cities and towns and two other states visited the center on its first day. It is open from 9 a. m. to 4 p. m. daily, Mondays through Fridays.

The \$1,000,000 worth of machine tools, paints, chemicals, metals, small parts and other equipment and materials sold the opening day compared with an average daily sales total of \$12,000 recorded prior to inauguration of the "one stop" sales service plan, March 27, according to Ballif.

The Alcoa surplus storage depot has been receiving war goods since January, but sales heretofore were handled on a mail order catalog basis through WA sales offices in Los Angeles (155 West Washington st.), San Diego and Phoenix. Purchases still may be made through these sales offices.

L.A. Delays Move On Rubber Co. Gas Lines

Los Angeles City Council action ordering the Board of Public Works to "cut and plug" gas pipe lines feeding the nation's largest synthetic rubber plant, at 190th st. on Vermont ave., Monday, was continued for 60 days.

In the meantime, negotiations will continue between the city and the Reconstruction Finance Corporation, which now owns the synthetic rubber plant, for a pipeline franchise from the Southern California Gas Company to the Vermont avenue plant, RFC attorney J. J. Leiberan said.

An industry and transportation committee report recommending that the lines be "cut and plugged," said that a \$500 good faith bond had been forfeited as neither the RFC nor the gas company has applied for a franchise.

A franchise for a five-inch and a nine-inch line earlier was awarded the government defense plant corporation, but the corporation has been taken over by the RFC, the report stated.

Caldwell said that during one period a large percentage of the applicants were for schooling in bartending, while in another period nearly all applicants were requesting apprenticeship training in embalming. But regardless of their preferences, he said, each and every one of those served were either placed in schools or apprenticeship training.
