State Chamber To Discuss Perishable Food Crop Loss

The present critical shortage of refrigerator cars which threatens a major portion of California's perishable food crops with spoilage will be the main business on the agenda of the State Chamber of Commerce Southern California Agricultural Committee meeting at noon May 28 at the Los Angeles Biltmore Hotel, it was announced today by Joy G. Jameson, Corona, chairman of the committee.

Speakers on the agenda of the meeting will include Virgil F. Frizzell, general freight agent Southern Pacific, Hugh T. Osborne, Imperial County Superintendent, and B. A. Harrigan, Imperial County agricultural commissioner, who will all discuss the refrigerator car shortage; D. W. McColly, director Farm Production Council, who will talk on farm labor housing; and John J. McElroy, State Agricultural Extension Service, who will discuss recruitment and placement of agricultural labor.


