Torrance's Fourth Annual Rodeo, Cowboy Dance and everything that goes with a wild-west show is taking form as a part of the Fourth of July Jubilee and Veterans Welcome Home celebration, according to C. Z. Ward and H. C. Callihan, of the Torrance Annual Rodeo committee.

## King, Thomas Dills Appear To Be Victors

While Governor Warren, was assured election for a second term, as a result of nomination by both major parties at Tuesday's election, Torrance voters watched the result of several other contests with interest. Rep. Cecil King was nominated for reelection by both Democrats and Republicans with a vote which showed, Democratic, King, 35,666; Willard Harper, 6,380; Tom B. Clark, 4,659; E. M. Reinheimer, 3,043; R. E. Gilreath, 1,728; Republican, King, 14,120; Reinheimer, 2,672; James Rosenbergs, 7,373.

Vincent Thomas carried away nominations of both major parties for Assemblyman from the 68th district, with a vote of 7,470 to J. F. Quinn's 2,329 for the Democratic nomination and 2,305 to Quinn's 965 votes for the Republican nomination.

Pat MacDonnell, secretary of Gardena Valley Chamber of Commerce, and well known in Torrance, was swamped with other candidates by Assemblyman Dills, of the 67th district, on both party tickets, with Dills' reelection assured.

While Torrance city precincts went on record substantially against the school bonds Tuesday, they appeared to carry on a district wide basis by a vote of about three to one.

Roy Rogers, famed rodeo man, promises to be in Torrance for the big show and features will include trick roping and riding, bareback bronc stunts, saddle bronc riding, Brahma bull riding, calf roping, bull dogging and, of course, the two clowns and the trick mule.

Torrance has had a rodeo each year for the past two years, and one season prior to the outbreak of hostilities, but this year the rodeo committee promises something which never has been equalled before in rodeo history.

Everything has been arranged, including the additional seats needed at Torrance ball park to pack in the throngs, and a feature this year will be the fact that veterans will be given free admission, after registration at Torrance Area Projects, Inc., headquarters to receive their passes.

The Fourth of July parade will find the rodeo performers taking an important part. Performances are scheduled for 8 p.m. July 3, and 2 p.m. July 4. The parade will be at 11 a.m. July 4 and the Cowboy Dance in the Civic Auditorium July 4 at 9 p.m.
