

CITY LICENSE ORDINANCE ASKS QUARTERLY FEES

Under the provisions of Ordinance No. 369, adopted for its final reading by the City Council Tuesday night, city licenses are to be paid quarterly in advance. At present, licenses are paid annually in advance. The ordinance amends Ordinance No. 225.

New Civil Pilot Training Program Designed To Aid Veterans

New and accelerated courses in aviation training ranging from basic ground school through multi-engine ratings were announced recently by the University of Southern California, College of Aeronautics, at Hancock Field, Santa Ana.

Designed to help veterans with refresher courses and higher ratings in aviation, the new curriculum is broken down into half-semester of eight weeks each, according to the director, Captain Allan Hancock. Veterans choosing aviation as a career may now enroll for an accelerated program under form 1950a, he said.

Flight training, it was stated, is co-ordinated with regular full-time courses for aircraft and engine mechanics and pre-engineering students aiming at the college certificate of Associate in Aeronautics. All courses afford students the opportunity to earn college units of credit.

A special summer short course for regular or special students or veterans who qualify for aviation training, will run from June 27 to August 24 to meet the requirements for a private pilot's certificate. It was announced. This includes basic ground school for three credit units and primary flight training for 1.5 credit units.

Operating on a schedule of 48 weeks, the College of Aeronautics is organized on the basis of three semesters of 16 weeks each year. Registration for the regular summer semester of 16 weeks and the summer short course of 8 weeks is scheduled for June 24, 25 and 28. Registration for the winter term opens October 17.

The College of Aeronautics is a C.A.A. approved primary and advanced flying school and is approved for veteran training by the Veterans Administration and the State Veterans' Welfare Board.

250 Army Riding Horses Ready For Auction

Two hundred and fifty Army riding horses are the magnet which is attracting daily crowds of World War II veterans to the Los Angeles stockyards where the horses are on pre-auction sale exhibition, according to W. D. Johnson, sales executive, who is directing the sale for War Assets Administration. These horses, recently declared "surplus" by the Army, are scheduled for sale during a one-day auction, exclusively to veterans at the stockyards on Friday, June 14. The following day, Saturday, all horses not purchased by veterans will be auctioned to commercial buyers.

Ninety-three of the horses boast sires or dams, or both, of thoroughbred strain, and the entire lot are of "above-average" blood lines. The group includes a number of polo ponies.

Veterans can secure additional information concerning this and other war surplus property at the special veterans' services and priorities office located at 3636 Beverly Blvd.

Under the recently amended war surplus property act, GI's receive second highest priority for purchase of war surpluses, right behind Federal agencies, and get top priority for automotive vehicles up to and including 2 1/2-ton trucks, construction, mining and agricultural machinery, tractors, and all medical, surgical and dental supplies and equipment, and typewriters.

These items, known as "veterans' set-aside" are sold exclusively to World War II veterans for business and personal use, but not for resale.

The horse auction will be in charge of Don B. Kates, former War Department "G-staff" colonel, representing the auctioneer for the War Assets Administration.

Military Order Of Purple Heart Hold Convention

ROCKET ATTACKS
