Victory Gardens Needed To Aid Food Supply

The world is short 350,000,000 bushels of wheat. This is nearly one-fourth of the total amount required.

The world is short 600,000,000 tons of rice. Only one-fourth of what we need is on hand and in sight.

The world is short 3,000,000,000 pounds of fat. There is only two-thirds of the normal requirement available.

The world is short 4,000,000,000 tons of sugar—short one-third of the needed supply.

These deficiencies cannot be made up by America alone, but we are being called upon to help with wheat, rice, fats and sugar. And help we must, or pay the price in years to come.

Victory gardeners can help by growing crops which will substitute for wheat and rice—the starchy foods. What is raised at home will reduce the amount purchased from the store. The store then will not have to purchase from the miller. Whole grain can then be shipped overseas.

Wheat Crops

It's not too late to plant beans, sweet corn, sweet potatoes, winter squash. These are all foods which can be stored for winter use either dry (sweet corn and beans), or canned or frozen (sweet corn or beans; yes, sweet potatoes and squash too), or can be stored as they come from the plants for winter use (dry beans, sweet potatoes and squash).

The planting season for sweet corn will include the whole month of July. Beans should be in the ground by the end of June and so should sweet potatoes and squash.

Other Vegetables

Tomatoes, of course, are not a substitute for wheat. They're important in a good diet, however, and should be grown for summer and winter use. They can be planted after the middle of July with reasonable assurance of a crop before frost. Planted in late June or early July they'll grow rapidly, be relatively free of disease and should set their fruit with the first bloom.

You can help tomatoes set their fruit by tapping the blossom stems with a small stick or lead pencil, or if tomatoes are on stakes or a trellis, by jarring

Merchant Marine Careers Await H.S. Graduates

High school seniors who desire to become officers in the U. S. Merchant Marine and apply for appointment as cadet-midshipmen in the U. S. Merchant Marine Cadet Corps must have their applications postmarked not later than October 1, 1946, in order to be considered for the next entrance examination of November 6, 1946. Seniors scheduled to be graduated in January or February 1947, with insufficient scholastic units when the application is submitted, will be permitted to take the November examination subject to satisfactory completion of studies in progress.

Youths 16½ to 21 years of age and armed force veterans to the age of 24 may apply. Candidates who complete the training will be qualified for a license as a deck or engineer officer in the U. S. Merchant Marine and a commission as Ensign, U. S. Maritime Service, upon being graduated from the U. S. Merchant Marine Academy. The four-year training course includes one year at sea on a merchant or training ship.

Tents, Tarps And Scout Uniforms Are Off Price Control

The OPA today announced the suspension from price control of tents and tarpaulins, official Boy Scout and Girl Scout uniforms, except footwear, woven decorative fabrics, both pile and flat, used in the manufacture and repair of railroad cars, buses and airplanes, decorative fabrics woven entirely of paper, glass or plastics (except cellulose acetate and Nylon), and pile fabrics produced by an electro-coating process.

Boy Scouts In Plans For Big Summer Program

Boy Scouts of the Los Angeles area council today exchanged school books for camp gear. The local Scout organization set a national record last year in having the largest number of troops and senior units conducting a summer time camp under volunteer leadership, according to H. Eugene Breitenbach, chairman of the camp committee. Indications today point toward an even greater accomplishment during the 1946 camping season, Breitenbach said.

Five camps are offered to the Scouts of the Los Angeles area council without charge for camping privileges. Camp Pepperdine in the Los Angeles National Forest at Jackson Lake, is the most popular spot during the summer season. Four of the sites are within hiding distance of the troop meeting places. The town sites are: Camp Arthur Letts in the Hollywood hills, Camp Rio Hondo in Bell Gardens, Camp Vaughn Scott in Torrance and Camp Sigler in South Pasadena.

Experienced Scout leaders have assumed the responsibilities of operating the camps. W. T. Lindsay heads the Camp Pepperdine staff and Frank Delgado is in charge of the program at Camp Arthur Letts. The camp program provides an opportunity for all Scouts to participate in the advancement program of Scouting which has been so highly praised by the military leaders in developing self-reliance and initiative. Swimming and life saving are also important program features of the Scout campers who have prepared for their summer camp by weekend outings during the year.

Scouts active in the Los Angeles area council now number more than 13,000 and a majority of the membership will enjoy a summer camp this year. Many of the troops will travel to national parks, recreation areas and public campgrounds this year with the release of travel restrictions, Breitenbach said.

the contractor absolutely and unconditionally. If money advanced is not used by the contractor for buying materials or carrying on the construction project, as agreed, the owner merely has a civil suit right of recovery for breach of contract.

Penal Code Sec. 506 makes the purpose for which it was advanced the crime of embezzlement. The Appellate Court, however, in the case of Peo. vs. Holder, 43 Cal. App. 45, decided in 1921, declared said Statute unconstitutional, as an interference with the right to contract and an attempt to imprison for debt. In other words, the owner runs the risk of not recovering his money except at oftentimes prohibitive cost.

It is true that the State Contractors License Board can and does revoke a contractor's license where money is advanced for a specific contract and is not used therefor but diverted to contractor's own use and the contract has been abandoned.

The License Board is required to issue a license to a qualified applicant in his trade who has no past record of dishonest dealings. However, the issuance of the license is in no way a guarantee of the contractor's operations or that he will continue to meet his obligation. The only remedy is the revocation of the license for violations as contained in the license law.

It is suggested that before entering into a building contract of any magnitude, the prospective builder make a thorough inquiry into the character, business standing, reputation, experience and ability of the contractor and obtain competent legal advice before signing any contract.

Perishable Food Storing Brings Health Warning

Care should be maintained in storing perishable foods, especially in summer months, is the warning issued by Jonathan R. Kirkpatrick, chief of the Los Angeles county health department's food and drugs division, following the food poisoning of 30 guests at a church festival last week.

Proper refrigeration at temperatures below 50 degrees Fahrenheit will inhibit or retard the growth of bacteria. Creamed food, especially, should be kept in the refrigerator until served, the food sanitarian said.


