### Five Draw Jail Sentences

Rushed to the Torrance Memorial hospital late Friday night following a fight in a cafe at 825 Border ave., Frank Lowery, 31, employee of the Columbia Steel Co. here, was reported in a serious condition as a result of knife wounds inflicted during the fight.

Convicted in Torrance City Court before Judge John Shidler of assault and battery upon Lowery were Felsano Hernandez, 18, Pvt. Joseph Martinez Hernandez, 19, John Reyes Cendejas 19, Pvt. Reyes Verdugo Ybarra, 20, and Charles Thomas Villegas, 22. Privates Hernandez and Ybarra are stationed with the Army at Ft. MacArthur, while the other youths were said to live in the Pueblo area.

Although Lowery's wounds were said to have been inflicted by a knife, police were unable to find the weapon used. The victim later was transferred to Los Angeles County general hospital.

Cendejas drew a sentence of 180 days in the county jail by the local judge, while Villegas and F. Hernandez were ordered to serve 30 days. The two servicemen were sentenced to 10 days each.

### Contract For New Hospital Expansion Let

Construction of a new laundry department annex and expansion of the present boiler room at Torrance Memorial Hospital was authorized by the hospital board of directors last Friday. Cost of the new construction and equipment will be approximately \$42,000, and it has been approved by the Civilian Production Administration, according to Grover C. Whyte, vice-president and chairman of the building committee.

The added facilities will relieve badly crowded conditions in the present basement at the hospital. The laundry department will be moved to a new basement room 34 ft. x 55 ft. to be built north of the present structure. Added space will be built onto the boiler room to accommodate a new steam heating boiler, replacing the present heating boiler which is beyond repair. A new electrical switchboard panel is also included.

Walls of the new construction are designed of sufficient strength to support a second story at a future date. Contract for the building has been awarded Oppert and Forsberg, and Lehmann Brothers will install the new heating equipment.

The hospital board also has plans completed for a new maternity wing designed for construction as soon as funds are available. If this new wing could be built, it would release approximately 18 beds, now occupied by maternity cases, for surgical and medical patients. Expansion of the present facilities for the maternity ward is sufficient to service the enlarged capacity of the hospital when the new wing is built, according to A. R. Walker, architect.

1/2 cup Pet Milk for quince sale  
 1 teaspoon unflavored gelatin  
 4 teaspoons cold water  
 1/4 cup sugar  
 3 tablespoons cocoa

for quince sale  
 3 tablespoons Pet Milk diluted with cold water  
 3 tablespoons water  
 1/2 teaspoon vanilla  
 1/2 teaspoon cocoa

Chill 1/2 cup milk until icy cold. Soften gelatin in cold water. Mix together sugar, cocoa and salt. Stir in diluted milk. Place over boiling water. Stir and cook 5 min. after water again boils. Stir in softened gelatin. Add vanilla. Chill until syrupy; stir occasionally while chilling. Whip chilled milk with rotary beater, or electric beater at high speed, until stiff. Fold into gelatin mixture. Freeze, without stirring, in automatic refrigerator tray at coldest temperature, or in mold buried in mixture of 3 parts crushed ice to 1 part ice cream salt. Serves 4.
