Brig. Gen. Hervey Commanding New 40th Division Of National Guard

Brig. Gen. Harcourt Hervey, one of its World War II commanders, will reorganize the 40th Infantry Division as part of the California National Guard, Adjutant General Curtis D. O'Sullivan said yesterday at Sacramento.

General Hervey, a vice-president of the Security-First National Bank of Los Angeles, commanded the division during its last operations on Panay and Negros in the Philippine Islands. Previously he was artillery commander.

An Air Medal was awarded the general in the Philippines for engaging in repeated artillery observation flights in a Piper Cub airplane. He flew at altitudes low enough to be placed under small arms fire as well as heavy anti-aircraft fire. He was also awarded the Silver Star for "extraordinary courage and leadership" and the Legion of Merit.

Furnishing strong support for rapid movements of infantry during landing operations in the Lingayen gulf, in the Philippines, resulted in the award of the Legion of Merit. In addition to providing "close-in" support for the infantry, he converted a battery of six Jap dual-purpose guns, developed effective firing tables, and fired 65 tons of enemy ammunition into Japanese positions.

General Hervey was commissioned a second lieutenant of field artillery, Regular Army, following his graduation from the University of California in 1916. He rose to the rank of lieutenant colonel when he served with the 1st Division in the AEF during World War I.

The general's World War I decorations were the Purple Heart, the Croix de Guerre, and the Fourragere of the Croix de Guerre, of France, for gallantry. He entered the California National Guard in 1922. In 1926 he assumed command of the 160th Infantry, "Los Angeles Own." In 1937 he first commanded the 80th Brigade, C.N.G., and was inducted into active federal service with the brigade on March 3, 1941.

General Hervey became commanding general of the division's artillery when the 40th Division was "streamlined" in 1941, at Camp San Luis Obispo. In that capacity he fought through the Solomon Islands, New Britain and the Philippines. He returned to the United States, from army of occupation duties in Korea, in December, 1945.



NEW HEADQUARTERS
Growing importance of Southern California and the Southwest states in commercial air transport was emphasized this week when Pan American World Airways established headquarters of a new "Southwestern Region" at Los Angeles. Arthur Ayes, long connected with aviation development in the West, has been appointed regional manager, executive in charge of the area.



AVIATION EXECUTIVE
Thomas Wolfe, young aviation executive who has played a major part in development of commercial air transport in the West, has been elected vice-president of Pan American World Airways. His appointment came shortly after Pan American was authorized by the CAB to link its Pacific and Atlantic routes at Calcutta, thus flying completely around the world.



Darby, the Board of Supervisors instructed the County Counsel to prepare an amendment to the building ordinance which would have the effect of placing small dwellings of cement block construction in the same category as wood frame buildings up to the same valuation of \$6,000, which do not require an approval of the Civilian Production Administration before the issuing of a building permit by the county.
