Eliminate All Fish In Reservoir Near San Dimas

According to Supervisor Raymond V. Darby, the County of Los Angeles in cooperation with the State Fish and Game Commission has recently eliminated all fish from the Puddingstone Reservoir in furtherance of the County's plan to have this reservoir made available to the sportsmen through stocking of the reservoir with bass and catfish.

The Flood Control District recently lowered the water in the reservoir to make repairs to the gate control mechanism and during this low water stage some 30 tons of fish were eliminated through seining operations and the use of rotenone. Seining operations by commercial fishermen resulted in some 6 tons of carp being taken out for commercial purposes. Seining operations by the Fish and Game Commission enabled them to remove all game fish for use in replanting elsewhere and the rest of the 30 tons were eliminated by the use of rotenone and the natural result of decreasing the oxygen supply during the low water period. The replanting of the reservoir will be carried out during the winter months by the Fish and Game Commission.

Army Extends Educational And GI Benefits

Educational benefits under the GI Bill of Rights did not end October 5, it was pointed out today by S/Sgt. Earl M. Bryant, local chief of Army Recruiting. Sgt. Bryant explained that any young man who enlists in the Army for one and one-half, two or three years and serves 90 days—one day of which occurs before the termination of World War II is declared—will be entitled, upon honorable discharge, to a year of education in the college, trade or business school of his choice for which he can qualify.

In addition, he is entitled to an additional month of education, up to 48 months, for each month (including the first 3) he serves prior to the official termination of the war. "For example," the recruiting head explained, "if a young man enlists tomorrow and the war is declared ended two months from tomorrow, and he is on active duty 90 or more days, he would be entitled to one year and two months of education. In addition to the educational benefits a recruit would also get the many other benefits of the GI Bill of Rights and family allowances for the duration plus six months."

EARLY PLANS FOR EARLY CAKES

The bright colors of candied fruits create a cheery pattern in thin slices of fruit cake. You'll want to bake a supply of this favorite holiday food treat. We like to allow a ripening period of at least three to four weeks before the luscious treats are cut.



Early plans and preparations for home-baked fruit cakes are in order. You'll need to determine the amounts to bake for the family needs and to include the supply you'd like for Christmas giving.

After you select the recipes, we'd suggest you make a careful list of the ingredients that must be purchased. Watch for the staples as you do the regular market and pick them up as you spot them.

BEFORE THE CHRISTMAS RUSH

As soon as the makings are assembled, it will be a good idea to finish before you become involved in the usual Christmas rush.

In fact, the cakes will be nicer if there is time for them to mellow. We like to allow a ripening period of at least three to four weeks before the luscious treats are cut.

CAREFUL STORAGE
Careful storage of the product is very important. Cakes that are well-filled with fruit will keep in perfect condition for several months if they are wrapped and stored correctly.

Aluminum foil is a new wrapping material for foods. It may be found in many markets and in the household or notion section of your favorite department store. This material is especially fine for food storage in which the exclusion of air is desired. The fruit cake should be wrapped thoroughly in the foil and stored in a cool, dry place. And be sure to re-wrap securely as portions of the cake are used.

or wine is to your liking, wrap the cake first in a wine-soaked cloth and then in the aluminum foil.

This bright new wrapping will be particularly attractive for the cakes you make for gifts. A clear cellophane outer wrap and pretty box will complete a lovely package.

Of course, you may stick to this tested storage method—leave the paper which was used to line the baking pan on the cake. Then wrap in several thicknesses of heavy waxed paper and store in an air-tight tin box or covered stone jar.

You may have a recipe that you always use. Here is one of our tested favorites that has been made many times. You might like to consider it in outlining your early plans for fruit cakes.

- HOLIDAY FRUIT CAKE**
- 1 C. oil or melted shortening
 - 1/2 C. brown sugar
 - 4 eggs, separate
 - 3 C. sifted flour
 - 8 tsp. cinnamon
 - 1/2 tsp. ground cloves
 - 2 tsp. allspice
 - 2 tsp. salt
 - 1 tsp. baking powder
 - 1 C. fruit juice
 - 4 Tbsp. molasses
 - 1/2 C. candied pineapple wedge
 - 2 C. whole candied cherries
 - 1/2 C. raisins
 - 3 chopped figs
 - 1 C. shaved citron
 - 3 C. broken nuts

Mix oil, sugar and egg yolks. Beat vigorously 2 minutes with rotary egg beater. Stir 2 C. of the sifted flour with spices, salt and baking powder. Add alternately with fruit juice to the first mixture. Blend in molasses. Mix fruit and nuts with remaining cup of flour. Add to cake mixture. Fold in stiffly beaten egg whites. Pour into pans lined with oiled waxed paper. Set oven heat control on modern gas range at 275°. Baking time will depend on size of pan.

Small loaf pan: 1 1/2 lbs., 1 1/2 hrs.
Large loaf pan: 3-4 1/2 lbs., 2-3 hrs.
Small tube pan: About 5 lbs., 3 1/2-4 hrs.
Large tube pan: About 10 lbs., 4 1/2-5 hrs.
