'Crusade For Christ' At Torrance Church

Dr. William Johnson, associate of Dr. Louis Evans and minister of evangelism at the First Presbyterian church of Hollywood, will be the guest speaker at the Central Evangelical United Brethren church in a 'Crusade for Christ' to be held November 24 to December 8. Services will be held each night at 7:30 with the exception of Mondays and Saturdays.
