

### High Scores Feature First League Games

Thrills, spills, sore muscles and a barrage of touchdowns were a dime a dozen as the newly formed Torrance Football league swung into action last Sunday on the high school's athletic field.

Fans numbering close to the 200 mark who witnessed the three contests, were greatly impressed with the variety of good plays and skill shown by the players in this seven-man brand of touch football.

In the first game, which started at 10:30 a.m., the Post club played consistent ball to down a determined but somewhat slower Torrance Showmen's team by a 24-0 score.

After a scoreless first period, Ernie Floyd zipped a touchdown pass to Jim Post in the end zone early in the second stanza, to start the scoring parade, and shortly before the half ended Bob Leech added six points by rudely intercepting a Showman's pass tossed by Adrian Thornberry and intended for Carmel Cook, and streaked through the Therspers to pay dirt.

Leech broke into the spotlight again in the third quarter when he broke loose on a running play and gave a beautiful exhibition of open field running, twisting downfield for 60 yards and another score.

Tommy Bishop, allied in the closing minutes of play, taking a 30-yard pass three yards from the goal, and stepped over unmolested, Jim Post propelling the pork hider.

In the second game the undermanned National Home Appliance squad tired quickly and went down to a 45-0 defeat under the slashing attack of the inspired El Prado Furniture team. (Those flashy grey and maroon jerseys would inspire any team). Scoring by quarters: first quarter: pass play, Gordie Smith to Bill Rogers. Pass, Gerald Jackson to Marvin Kent. Kent pounced on a juggled Home Appliance pass from center in the end zone. Second quarter: Donnie Cook skirred over for five yards. Pass play: Cook to Kent. Third quarter: scoreless. Fourth quarter: Cook picked up good interference and ambled 50 yards to a score.

Gerald Godard tagged Bob Wright of the Appliance squad behind the goal line for a safety. Pass, Cook to Kent and conversion pass, Cook to Rogers, ended the scoring. The four touchdowns scored by Marvin Kent place him far ahead of the rest of the players for league scoring honors.

Ravens vs. Dirty Seven drew a good number of spectators, who were treated to a beautiful show of speedy runs and accurate passing by the Dirty Seven team, as they buried the Ravens club gridders under a 33-7 score.

The winner's attack was spearheaded by the bullseye passing of Bob Golden and the shifty running of Paul Biller and Eddie Roberts.

Scoring by quarters: first quarter: pass play, 35 yards, Godin to Bill Moon in the end zone. Second quarter: pass, Biller to Roberts. Biller ran end to convert. Third quarter: pass, Golden to Roberts, conversion pass Golden to Bill George. Fourth quarter: pass, Golden to Biller, conversion pass Golden to Bill Walsmith. At this point the Ravens scored their 7 points on a pass from Donnie Cook, who had replaced a tired Raven, to Tom Justice, and Cook ran the left flank to convert.

The most thrilling run of the day occurred on the last play of the game, when Biller intercepted a Raven pass on his own goal line and ran 90 yards through the entire Raven team to score.

"To comply with the by-laws of the national organization, members were required to have sons in the service of the Navy," Mrs. W. R. Osborn, publicity chairman, reported, "and with the close of the second World War, many of the members were no longer eligible for membership when their sons were discharged from service."

The club has enjoyed an outstanding record of service from its inception a few years ago, meeting every week for sewing. The faithful members were seemingly few, but their accomplishments were great. Packages were sent to the service men in far away places; pneumonia jackets were sent to the hospital in the Aleutian islands, baby layettes were made for wives of Navy men, and at the time the club disbanded they were meeting their obligation of \$15 per month to the Long Beach Naval hospital, which they pledged several months ago.
