

Yuma Mesa, Gila Lands Offered For Homesteading; Veterans First

The Bureau of Reclamation is proceeding expeditiously with the work necessary to open about 12,000 acres of public lands on the Gila and Yuma projects, and every effort will be made to have these lands available for homestead entry during calendar year 1947.

A total of 4,800 acres on the Yuma Mesa division of the Gila project and 1,300 acres on the Yuma project will be included in a joint first opening. The second opening of public land on the Yuma Mesa division will include 6,070 acres. Predevelopment work on land included in the second opening will be dependent upon appropriation by the Congress of adequate funds to complete the work during fiscal year 1948, Director Moritz stated.

A proposed time table of operations required to open the land for homestead entry has been submitted to the Commissioner of the Bureau of Reclamation. Tentative approval of this schedule has been received but additional details must be worked out before a definite announcement of the opening dates can be made.

The land will be divided into family-size farms of from 40 to 160 acres, averaging about 90 acres. The land on the Gila project is relatively small number

of 40-acre farms are being established for citrus development. Farm units on the Yuma project will have an average size of about 50 acres. The smaller farm units on both projects contain, on the average, better soils.

In addition to the 10,870 acres of public land on the Yuma Mesa division to be opened for homestead entry, about 12,000 acres of privately owned land will be served by irrigation works already constructed or now under construction by the Bureau.

No applications for homestead farms can be accepted until the public notices are issued, Director Moritz explained. Following the announcement of the first or joint opening, interested veterans will be sent the necessary forms and will be given a 90-day preference period over non-veterans in making application. The application forms also will indicate the deadline date at which applications will be considered as having been received simultaneously. Applications from qualified veterans of both World War I and World War II will be eligible for consideration.

Applications for homesteads will be screened by a 5-member board appointed by the Commissioner of the Bureau of Reclamation.

Ure Car Owners To Apply Now For License

Motor vehicle owners of Torrance and Lomita were urged this week by the Department of Motor Vehicle officials to apply now for their 1947 renewal fees, and avoid the rush certain to start later.

No branch offices will be installed locally, it was announced, and residents of the area are instructed to pay their fees in Long Beach at 700 E. Broadway.

This office reports better service awaits car owners at this time. This, they explain, is due to a comparative lull in motor-ists seeking renewal applications.

Applicants are required to bring their 1946 registration card, showing their present address, and to present the amount of the fee. Cash is acceptable over the counter but should not be sent by mail, it was pointed out. Postal, bank or express money orders are honored. The amount is shown on the lower left hand corner of the 1946 registration card.

Penalties equal to 100 percent of the registration fee and 50 percent of the vehicle license fee are due on all vehicles for which application for license renewal has not been filed, the department warned.
