Gasoline Prices Up Half Cent By Standard Oil Co.

To partially cover higher costs of doing business, Standard Oil Company of California Tuesday announced an increase of one-half cent a gallon in the wholesale and retail price of gasoline and kerosene, and one-quarter of a cent in the price of Diesel and heating oils.

In some areas, further slight increases have been posted to partially offset an increase in transportation rates which has been in effect generally in the company's marketing area since January 1.

Salvation Army Center Completes Busiest Year

The Salvation Army Men's Social Service center, located at 1370 Alamosa ave., Long Beach, has just concluded one of the busiest years in its long history, according to Major Orlo Ellison, manager of the South Bay area, which includes the Long Beach social service center.

During the year's activities the local center has provided 34,869 meals, 1,912 beds, 1,350 garments and 1,756 shoes. Thousands of the less fortunate have received assistance in various ways, including hundreds who have been interviewed, helped and advised on all kinds of tangled problems by Major Ellison and members of his staff.

The program is unique in that no financial assistance has been solicited during the year. The center, which receives all kinds of cast-off articles, uses the men it shelters to repair and rebuild waste material which in turn is sold at a very nominal price, thus making it self-supporting.

A suitable job was found for him at the center. Another family who had "tried" to live in their jalopy for twenty-two days came seeking food and shelter.

Last year articles donated to the Salvation Army social service created jobs for a daily average of 60 persons. This year, due to the center's enlarged facilities, it is hoped that more than double that number may be given the opportunity of maintaining their self-respect.

Employers Get Warning To File U.S. Tax Forms

Employers of Southern California were today reminded by Collector of Internal Revenue Harry C. Westover that they have just eight days left in which to file federal withholding tax forms to report wages paid during 1946.

By January 31, Collector Westover said, the following must be done: Form W-1 must be filed to report and pay income taxes with held from employees' wages during the fourth quarter of last year.

Form W-2, in duplicate, must be given every employee from whose wages taxes were withheld during 1946. This is the withholding receipt which can be used by the employee as his income tax return.

Form W-3, must be filed as the annual reconciliation of all wages paid last year. The total reported on this form should equal the total of all W-2's.

Wilmington Hall To Be Opened To Single Workers

Through agreement between the City Housing Commission, the Mayor's Emergency Housing Committee, and the A F of L Building Trades Council, the closed single men's dormitories at Wilmington Hall, located at 435 Neptune st., in Wilmington, will be re-opened for occupancy by single, in-migrant building trades workers in a select category of critical skills, it was announced today by Nicola Giulli, chairman of the City Housing Commission. The new order takes effect immediately.

At the same time, applicants for living quarters at Wilmington Hall will be taken from single male veterans of World War II, whether they are construction workers or not. Rates will be \$4.50 per week, per person, in a double room, and \$6.50 per week in a single room.

Purpose of providing living quarters for in-migrant workers is to attract enough skilled mechanics from the east and mid-west.
