### Christian Jew Lecturer To Appear

Charles Haimovitz is a Jew who was born in Palestine and later came to this country with his parents. He was brought up in the orthodox Jewish faith, but, dissatisfied with his traditional religion, he reached out into other fields and eventually became a Christian. He is naturally very well versed in the ceremonies and the rituals of his traditional faith, and literally hundreds of thousands have thrilled to his dynamic and dramatic preaching in the larger cities in the United States such as Detroit, Chicago, Cleveland, and other places. As a lecturer, he displays fiery enthusiasm that transmits itself very readily to his vast audience. He has been instrumental in leading many of his Jewish

friends to the acceptance of Christianity. His discussions revolve largely around present-day vital issues in both national and international affairs in the light of Bible prophecy. Such subjects as "The Future of Russia," "The Return of the Jews to Palestine," "The New Era Among God's Ancient People," "The Coming Rise of the Roman Empire," "America's Place in the Future World," and many other topics. He is particularly well-informed in political, as well as religious affairs. ### Naval Reserve Training Cruise Slated In May

A two-week training cruise during which either a Mexican or Canadian port will be visited, will be conducted for Naval Reserve by the Eleventh Naval District from May fourth to eighteenth, Captain S. G. Hooper, USN, District Director of Naval Reserve has announced. Ten officers, six chief petty officers, and 145 men will be carried. The USS John A. Bole, modern destroyer, has been designated to carry the Reserves. Members of both the inactive and organized components of the Reserve are eligible for the cruise. They will be furnished with transportation between their homes and the port of embarkation, will receive half a month's pay, and will be provided with necessary uniforms and bedding. Application forms may be obtained from the office of the District Director of Naval Reserve and must be returned not later than April 14.
