Baked Potato Cake

- 4 or 5 large potatoes, peeled and shredded
- 3 eggs, slightly beaten
- ¼ cup sifted flour
- 2 tspns. baking powder
- 2 tspns. salt
- ¼ tspns. pepper
- ½ cup uncooked farina
- ¼ cup breadcrumbs
- 1/3 cup shortening

Serves eight.

Shred raw potatoes into bowl, then add beaten eggs, mixing thoroughly. Add dry ingredients, mixed and sifted. Stir in melted shortening. Pour into greased pan and bake in moderate oven until firm in the center (about one hour). Serve hot with creamed cooked meat.


